 - a. Only place we know Paul went
 - b. Paul normally uses provincial terms
 - c. Nothing else to call them
 - d. Date see below
- B. When was Galatians written prior to Acts 15
 - 1. After two Jerusalem trips (1:18/A 9:26-27; 2:1-10/A 11:28-30)
 - 2. Other considerations
 - a. No Timothy (all but Titus; Ephesians) from south; Acts 16

- b. Prominent mention of Barnabas (2:1, 9, 13) Acts 13-14 & 16
- c. Strange actions of Barnabas & Peter after Acts 15?!!!
- d. No mention of the Acts 15 decision or letter!
- C. Not critical unless ulterior motives!
 - 1. Good people hold both sides of both issues
 - 2. But some North/late have ulterior motives
 - 3. DVD (Founding A Religion From Picture of Peter to Elaine Pagels)
 - 4. To undermine faith & gospel like Judaizers!

III. The Key Issue: Apostolic Unity

- A. Paul claims unity with other Apostles
 - 1. Galatians 2:6-9: 1:8-9
 - 2. Eph 3:4-6 all apostles receive mystery; Gospel
- B. Acts claims unity between apostles (Acts 15:5-11, 13-19)
- C. Others claim unity of faith (and Paul) Jude 3, 17; 2 Pet 3:2, 15
- D. Apostolic fathers quote apostles as Scripture; heretics deny some

IV. Conclusion & Summary

- A. Church has single solid foundation (Eph 2:19-20)
 - 1. Apostles are foundation of church (Eph 2:19-20)
 - 2. No disunity between them! Spirit protected

- B. The apostolic teaching is preserved in the Word
 - 1. We know what early church believed from Word
 - 2. Other writings always rejected heresy
 - 3. One single, apostolic foundation & church
- C. God's apostolic Word: how firm a foundation!

Paul and the Other Apostles Galatians 1:13-2:10 December 26, 2004 How Firm A Foundation 2 Corinthians 13:14 ¹⁸ Then after three years, I went up to Jerusalem to get acquainted with Peter and stayed with him fifteen days. Galatians 1:18

²⁶ When he came to Jerusalem, he tried to join the disciples, but they were all afraid of him, not believing that he really was a disciple. ²⁷ But Barnabas took him and brought him to the apostles. He told them how Saul on his journey had seen the Lord and that the Lord had spoken to him, and how in Damascus he had preached fearlessly in the name of Jesus. Acts 9:26-27

¹ Fourteen years later I went up again to Jerusalem, this time with Barnabas. I took Titus along also. ² I went in response to a revelation and set before them the gospel that I preach among the Gentiles. But I did this privately to those who seemed to be leaders, for fear that I was running or had run my race in vain. Galatians 2:1

²⁸ One of them, named Agabus, stood up and through the Spirit predicted that a severe famine would spread over the entire Roman world. (This happened during the reign of Claudius.)²⁹ The disciples, each according to his ability, decided to provide help for the brothers living in Judea.³⁰ This they did, sending their gift to the elders by Barnabas and Saul. Ac 11:28-30

⁶ As for those who seemed to be important-- whatever they were makes no difference to me; God does not judge by external appearance-- those men added nothing to my message.⁷ On the contrary, they saw that I had been entrusted with the task of preaching the gospel to the Gentiles, just as Peter had been to the Jews.⁸ For God, who was at work in the ministry of Peter as an apostle to the Jews, was also at work in my ministry as an apostle to the Gentiles.⁹ James, Peter and John, those reputed to be pillars, gave me and Barnabas the right hand of fellowship when they recognized the grace given to me. They agreed that we should go to the Gentiles, and they to the Jews. Galatians 2:6-9

8 But even if we or an angel from heaven should preach a gospel other than the one we preached to you, let him be eternally condemned! 9 As we have already said, so now I say again: If anybody is preaching to you a gospel other than what you accepted, let him be eternally condemned! Gal 1:8-9

⁴ In reading this, then, you will be able to understand my insight into the mystery of Christ, ⁵ which was not made known to men in other generations as it has now been revealed by the Spirit to God's holy apostles and prophets. ⁶ This mystery is that through the gospel the Gentiles are heirs together with Israel, members together of one body, and sharers together in the promise in Christ Jesus. Ephesians 3:4-6

5 Then some of the believers who belonged to the party of the Pharisees stood up and said, "The Gentiles must be circumcised and required to obey the law of Moses." 6 The apostles and elders met to consider this question. 7 After much discussion, Peter got up and addressed them: "Brothers, you know that some time ago God made a choice among you that the Gentiles might hear from my lips the message of the gospel and believe. 8 God, who knows the heart, showed that he accepted them by giving the Holy Spirit to them, just as he did to us. 9 He made no distinction between us and them, for he purified their hearts by faith. 10 Now then, why do you try to test God by putting on the necks of the disciples a yoke that neither we nor our fathers have been able to bear? 11 No!
