## II. Two Ways of Life

- A. The vice and virtue lists
  - 1. Common in antiquity
  - 2. These reflect God's character not culture
  - 3. Lists are representative not exhaustive
  - 4. Describing two mutually exclusive ways of life
- B. Two sources for patterns of life: flesh & Spirit
  - 1. The source of evil: the flesh/sinful nature
    - a. Flesh in these verses desires & acts
    - b. Flesh produces evil living
  - 2. The source of good: the Holy Spirit
    - a. Spirit in these verses live, led, fruit, step

b. Spirit produces righteous living

#### III. The Works of the Flesh

- A. Flesh human w/ Satan in rebellion against God
  - 1. Christians believe body is good not Gnostics
  - 2. Many sins in list do not even require body
  - 3. Much deeper than just our body Rom 8:7-8
- B. Rebellious flesh produces evil actions & attitudes
  - 1. A litany of evil actions and attitudes
  - 2. Objective evil not just culture
    - a. Sexual sins accepted in GR world
    - b. Paul emphasizes these against culture
    - c. 19, Rom 13:13; 1 Cor 6:9; Eph 5:3-7; Col 3:5-6
  - 3. Ways humans express their rebellion to God

### IV. The Remedy to the Flesh: the Spirit

- A. What Will Not Work: Law (or Asceticism)
  - 1. Law We are not under law (v 18; Rom 8:3-4)
  - 2. Asceticism Col 2:20-23
- B. The Spirit sets us free from the flesh

- 4. Our flesh died with Christ (v24; 2:20; Rom 8:3-4)
- 5. Those receiving Spirit will NOT practice sin (16)
- 6. Not perfection but will not practice (v19-21)
- 7. Spirit produces new fruit w/o law (v22-23)

### V. Conclusion – Our Glorious Life In Christ

- A. Our justification is by faith alone
  - 1. We are not saved by our efforts
  - 2. We are saved only through faith
  - 3. Christ has saved us from God's wrath!
- B. Our experience of Christ and the Spirit radically change us
  - 1. When we turn to Christ we are born again
  - 2. We are now able to live for him free from sin
  - 3. He changes us but we must walk with Him
- C. Baptism symbol and grace of new life in Christ

7 the sinful mind is hostile to God. It does not submit to God's law, nor can it do so. 8 Those controlled by the sinful nature cannot please God. Romans 8:7-8

5 Put to death, therefore, whatever belongs to your earthly nature: sexual immorality, impurity, lust, evil desires and greed, which is idolatry. 6 Because of these, the wrath of God is coming. Colossians 3:5-6

18 But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under law. Galatians 5:18

3 For what the law was powerless to do in that it was weakened by the sinful nature, God did by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful man to be a sin offering. And so he condemned sin in sinful man, 4 in order that the righteous requirements of the law might be fully met in us, who do not live according to the sinful nature but according to the Spirit.

Romans 8:3-4

20 Since you died with Christ to the basic principles of this world, why, as though you still belonged to it, do you submit to its rules: 21 "Do not handle! Do not taste! Do not touch!"? 22 These are all destined to perish with use, because they are based on human commands and teachings. 23 Such regulations indeed have an appearance of wisdom, with their self-imposed worship, their false humility and their harsh treatment of the body, but they lack any value in restraining sensual indulgence.
