- A. 60's and up time of harvest celebration
- B. Not as physically strong as before (Pr 20:29)
- C. Not required to labor as hard as before celebration
- D. A new way to be fruitful (Ps 92:14; Pr 20:29)

III. The Fruit of Our Later Years

- A. Long life brings life experience (Ps 78:2-7)
 - 1. Able to share more than knowledge life!
 - 2. Transmission of faith requires intergenerational work
- B. Long life brings perspective of whole race (2 Tim 4:7)
 - 1. Can only come with time & experience
 - 2. See what changes and what stays the same
 - 3. Keeps younger gen. from distorted view of life

- C. Long life brings wisdom (Job 12:12)
 - 1. True wisdom (not perfection) develops over years
 - 2. This can be shared with younger generations

IV. Responding to The Later Years

- A. Younger generations respect, listen, learn
 - 1. God demands we respect our elders (Lev 19:32)
 - 2. God expects us to listen and learn from our elders (Pr 23:22)
 - 3. Problem: our culture worships youth!
 - 4. Problem: our culture has a false notion of "progress" & "evolution"
- B. Older generation invest in us!
 - You have an inheritance for us now! (Pr 13:22)
 - 2. Includes grandchildren as well (Pr 13:22)
 - 3. Problem: many elderly are put on the shelf
 - 4. Problem: many elderly use freedom only to play not invest
