II. Be Strong In the Grace – Run the Race

- A. Be strong in the grace of Christ (v1)
 - 1. Deals with a personal walk with Christ
 - 2. Metaphors describe strenuous walk athlete v5
 - 3. Requires us to be strong (v1; Eph 6:10; Phil 4:13)
 - 4. To live for Christ we need grace (v1)
 - 5. The means of grace 7 this year
- B. Can't help others unless we walk with Christ

III. Receive, Guard, and Pass On the Faith

- A. Receive the faith from others (v2; heard from me)
 - 1. Timothy learned from Paul (v2; 2 Tim 1:13)

- 2. Timothy had learned from others (2 Tim 3:14-15)
- 3. We learn the faith from someone discipled
- B. Guard the faith from change/error (v2; entrust)
 - 1. Teaching entrusted to Timothy (v2)
 - 2. Keep teaching, guard deposit by Spirit (2 Tim 1:13-14)
 - 3. Timothy guard what entrusted (1 Tim 6:20-21)
 - 4. All must hold teachings exactly as given (1 Cor 11:2)
 - 5. All must hold to teachings early! (2 Th 2:15)
- C. Pass On the faith to others (v2; entrust to others)
 - 1. Teaching now given to others (v2)
 - 2. Ezra learned, kept and taught (Ezra 7:10)
 - 3. Pass to faithful men who repeat (v2)
 - 4. Faithful men elders (Titus 1:6-9)
 - 5. All called! (v2 many witnesses; 1 Tim 4:6,11,13,16)
- D. The endless cycle also pass on to others (v2)
