- A. Believers union with Christ
 - 1. Into Christ, death, with, union (Rom 6:3-7)
 - 2. In Christ, in Him, with Him, with Christ (Col 2:9-15)
 - 3. Vital union between believers and Christ!
- B. Baptism intimately connected with this union
 - 1. Baptized into death, buried with Him (Rom 6:3-4)
 - 2. Buried with Him in baptism (Col 2:11-12)
 - 3. Baptism is sign and seal of this union
- C. Elements of union with Christ signified in baptism
 - 1. Cleansing/purification from sin (Acts 22:16; Tit 3:5)

2. Death and resurrection (Rom 6:3-4; Col 2:11-12)

III. Means of Grace in Struggle Against Sin

- A. Baptism and freedom from sin's power
 - 1. Dead to sin; buried, raised to new life (Rom 6:1-4)
 - 2. Sinful nature circumcised; buried, raised (Col 2:11-12)

 - 2. Means of grace actually helps in struggle
 - 3. Old man killed, cut off, buried don't leave Him

The Benefits of Baptism

Romans 6:1-7 Colossians 2:9-15 March 21, 2010 Prayer 1 Thessalonians 5:23-24 A sacrament is a special symbol given by God that, when received in faith, serves as a sign and seal of His promises to us, functions as a means of grace to strengthen us, and through which we testify of our faith in Him and His promises.

In him you were also circumcised, in the putting off of the sinful nature, not with a circumcision done by the hands of men but with the circumcision done by Christ, ¹² having been buried with him in baptism and raised with him through your faith in the power of God, who raised him from the dead. Colossians 2:11-12

And now what are you waiting for? Get up, be baptized and wash your sins away, calling on his name.

he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit,
