Theme: As we ponder the great works of the Lord in redeeming and giving us His covenantal commands, we respond with heartfelt praise and willing obedience.

### I. Intro – Great literary devices

- A. I have tried to learn and appreciate poetry
- B. Poetry is full of literary devices
- C. These can give a clue to meaning
- D. Psalm 111 has a couple of clear literary devices
- E. It is an acrostic
  - 1. 22 lines, each starting with successive Hebrew letter
  - 2. Some letters are prepositions; conjunctions note word linked
    - a. In the company (v1); and his righteousness (v3)
  - 3. In English translations some not at beginning of line
    - a. Remembered & gracious (v4)
  - 4. Sometimes an unusual word is used to fit acrostic
    - a. Food v5 normally 'prey' but refers to manna/quail here
  - 5. All of these are listed on the web worthy of reflection!
- F. I will note some others at we look at this Psalm of praise

## II. Theme: Praise the LORD for His Great Works

- A. This is clearly a psalm of praise to Yahweh
  - 1. Note the intro Hallelu Yah not part of acrostic
  - 2. Inclusio of praise thanks (v1); praise forever (v10)
  - 3. Praise in the gathered congregation (liturgical; v1)

- 4. God's people are gathered to praise Him!
- B. Praise Yahweh for His great works!
  - 1. This forms the heart of the psalm vv2-9
  - 2. The works are the first thing mentioned in  $v^2$
  - 3. Works (or a synonym) occurs 5 times in Psalm 111
    - a. v2 works of the Lord
    - b. v3 full of splendor & majesty is His work
    - c. v4 his wondrous works
    - d. v6 power of His works
    - e. v7 the works of His hands

## III. Studying and Pondering Yahweh's Works

- A. We must study (ESV) or ponder (NIV) His works (v2)
  - 1. We are commanded to study/ponder God's works
  - 2. This leads to praise; no ponder = no praise!
  - 3. Two categories (v9) lead to praise!
    - a. Redemption
    - b. Covenant especially covenantal commands
- B. Redemption Exodus, wilderness, conquest (vv3-6)
  - 1. Remembered Passover [Exodus 12:14]
  - 2. Gracious and compassionate YHWH [Ex. 34:6]
  - 3. Food manna in wilderness [Exodus 16; Deut 8:3]

- 4. Covenant Covenant & Decalogue (Exodus 19-24)
- 5. Inheritance book of Joshua
- 6. This is a powerful call to remember redemption!
- C. Covenantal commands (vv 7-8)
  - 1. A shift to God's covenantal commands (vv7-8)
  - 2. Note these are His work as much as redemption
  - 3. They are given for our good & blessing
  - 4. As a fish was made for water, we were made to walk in God's commands
  - 5. He not only acted in history He gave covenantal Word

## IV. Our Response to God's Great Works

- A. We give Him praise
  - 1. This is the theme of the whole Psalm! (vv1, 10)
  - 2. The response of praise (v9)
  - 3. Pondering God's great works leads to praise!
  - 4. If you don't feel like praising ponder His work!
- B. We obey His commands out of gratitude
  - 1. Obey His precepts faithfully & uprightly (vv7-8)
  - 2. Fear Yahweh & keep them wisdom (v10 NIV)
  - 3. Note fear like Jer spoke of pure reverence
  - 4. But note order redemption, then keep commands

- 5. Obedience our response to God's redemptive work
- 6. If you don't feel like obeying pondering His works!

# V. Applying the Word - the Lord's Table

- A. Pondering Christ Who has redeemed us
  - 1. Christ our Passover Lamb has been sacrificed
  - 2. His blood has stayed the Angel of Death!
  - 3. He has delivered us from slavery to sin and fear
  - 4. He has made us His own!
  - 5. He gives food to sustain us on our journey
  - 6. His Spirit never leaves us even when we sin
  - 7. He gives us the inheritance of the nations now
  - 8. His Spirit is using us to draw others to Himself
  - 9. He will be with us forever into eternity!
  - 10. Praise His name!
- B. The Lord's Table v5
  - 1. Church Fathers saw verse 5 as a type of Communion
  - 2. At this Table He meets us, feeds us
  - 3. At this Table , He remembers His covenant
  - 4. At this Table, we praise & are strengthened to obey Praise the LORD for His Great Works!
