 - 5. Jesus is the Hope of all nations (Rom. 15:12)

 - 1. Wait; hope; seek; it is good! (vv24-26)
 - 2. Wait for God expectantly (Psa 130:5-8)
- B. The key preach to ourselves each day (Lam 3:24)
