 - 3. Isaiah 9:5 bloody relics of war destroyed
 - 4. Ecclesiastes 3:8 time for war & peace
 - 5. 1 Kings 4:24-25 no strife without or within
 - 6. Note Solomon's name related to Shalom peace
- B. Peace individually internal peace; well being
 - 1. Certainly part of peace as well
 - 2. Judges 6:23 peace no fear
 - 3. John 14:27 peace; not fearful, troubled hearts
 - 4. Jer 29:11 personal prosperity/well being

III. A Fuller Understanding of Peace

- A. Peace is intimately linked to righteousness
 - 1. Isaiah 9:6-7 Peace, justice, righteousness
 - 2. Isaiah 32:17 fruit of righteousness is peace
 - 3. Isaiah 48:18 peace like a river, righteousness
 - 4. Isaiah 48:22 No peace for the wicked
 - 5. Isaiah 57:20-21 No rest or peace for the wicked
 - 6. Isaiah 60:17 peace & righteousness rulers
- B. False prophets offer peace apart from righteousness
 - 1. Jeremiah 6:14 treat wound of sin lightly
 - 2. No peace for the wicked!
 - 3. Repeated verbatim in Jeremiah 8:11

IV. Jesus - Our Prince of Peace

- A. Jesus brings peace to us
 - 1. Isaiah 9:6-7 Peace, justice, righteousness
 - 2. Isa 9:6-7 God focus given; titles; zeal of LORD
 - 3. This must be the work of God not man
- B. Jesus Himself is our peace
 - 1. Judges 6:24 Yahweh is Peace He IS SHALOM
 - 2. Micah 5:2-5 Messiah coming; He is their peace
 - 3. Ephesians 2:14 He Himself is our peace

- 4. Peace with God Rom 5:1-2; Isa 53:5 justification
- 5. Peace internally John 14:27
- 6. Fills our mouth with Gospel of peace Isaiah 52:7

Unwrapping Peace in Christ

For he himself is our peace... Ephesians 2:14
