- B. Coverdale Bible (1535) \$445,00
- C. Wycliffe Bible from 1300's worth over \$2 million
- D. Caedmon manuscript priceless!!
- E. Truly treasures!
- F. But the Word of God is the greatest treasure of all!

II. The Treasure of God's Word

- A. Note how Job treasures God's Word
 - 1. Job has not left God's word behind (v12a)
 - 2. Job treasures the words of God's mouth (v12b)
 - 3. Treasured more than daily bread (v12bc)
 - 4. And this is in spite of great afflictions!
- B. The treasure of God's Word
 - 1. More precious than a lot silver & gold (Ps. 119:72)
 - 2. More precious than much pure gold (Ps. 19:9-10)
- C. We are called to delight in this treasure
 - 1. Ps 1:1-2 blessed; no heed to wicked; delights
 - 2. Ps 112:1 Blessed delight in God's word (acrostic)
 - 3. Psalm 119 magnum opus to God's Word

- a. Delight in God's word 9 times
- b. Love God's word 11 times
- c. Examples:
 - 1. v47 delight and love commands
 - 2. v16 delight in decrees; not neglect word
 - 3. v97 I love your law; meditate all day long

III. Why We Should Treasure God's Word

- A. It is God's Word His lips; His mouth (Job 23:12)
- B. It is our spiritual food (Matthew 4:4)
- C. It is our foundation (Matthew 7:24-27) hear and obey
- D. It sustains us in times of trouble (Job; Psa. 119:50)
- E. The sacrifice paid to get it to us (Heb 11:35-38)
 - 1. Prophets and apostles martyred to write it
 - 2. Christians suffered to pass it along
 - 3. Reformers died to translate it so we could read
 - 4. This Word was paid for with the blood the saints
- F. It teaches us the way of salvation (2 Timothy 3:15)
 - 1. The is the central focus of Scripture
 - 2. This is the **only** place we can learn this!!
