Theme: As Christians grow in their knowledge of God and His will, their lives are transformed so that they are pleasing to God.

- A. Trip to visit Tim, Becky, Josh, and Owen
- B. Really glad to be able to help out and have fun!
- C. What if we could not be there? How can we help?
- D. Trouble in Colossae but Paul can't go!
- E. He prays and gives them instruction
- F. What does Paul think they really need?

II. Link Between Paul's Thanksgiving & Prayer

- A. I noted this link last week
 - 1. Paul's thanksgiving is always directed to God
 - 2. Paul's thanksgiving always leads to prayer
- B. Clear links between 1:3-8 and 1:9-14
 - 1. Table with common vocabulary and themes
 - 2. What we saw last week carries forward

III. Paul's Prayer for the Colossians

- A. The request praying and asking
 - 1. We have not stopped consistent prayer
 - 2. Praying and asking both describe same thing
- B. The request to be filled with knowledge of His will

- 1. Paul wants them to be filled not just a dab!
 - a. Paul will use this concept a lot in the letter
 - b. Fulness likely key teaching for Gnostics in Colossae
- 2. Knowledge, wisdom, understanding
 - a. These root words appear 14x in Colossians!
 - b. Philippians 1:9-11; 2 Peter 3:17-18; Hosea 4:6
 - c. Knowledge, wisdom, etc. are important!
 - d. Beware of anti-intellectualism it is ungodly
- 3. Knowledge of His will this is true knowledge (v9)
 - a. Not just speculative thoughts Him & His will
 - b. Proverbs 9:10; Psalm 111:10; Deuter. 4:5-6
 - c. Jesus is the True Wise One Isaiah 11:1-3
- 4. Prayer know God, His Word and how to apply it

IV. The Purpose/Result of Paul's Prayer

- A. Purpose/result in order that (vv10-12; same sentence as v9)
 - 1. vv9-11 all one sentence in Greek
 - 2. in order that purpose or result (purpose most likely)
 - 3. This shows the goal of knowing God and His will
- B. The reason a life worthy of the Lord, pleasing Him
 - 1. Two ideas; one reality life worthy/pleasing to Lord
 - 2. Literally 'walk' worthy walking the path of wisdom

- 3. Walk as Jesus walked obeying God's revealed will
- C. Four characteristics of a worthy, pleasing life (vv10-12 participles)
 - 1. Bearing fruit in every good work (v10)
 - a. Faith producing works; know God act like Him!
 - b. You serve God by serving others; applying the Word
 - 2. Growing in the knowledge of God
 - a. The same as the prayer; continual growth spiral
 - b. But we only grow in knowledge as we obey
 - 3. Being strengthened
 - a. Being strengthened by His power; we need this!
 - b. Being strengthened for endurance and patience
 - c. We will face opposition need endurance & patience
 - 4. Giving thanks joyfully to the Father
 - a. I take "joyfully" with giving thanks like NIV; against ESV
 - b. Back to thanksgiving!
 - c. 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18
 - d. A worthy, pleasing life is full of joyful, prayerful, thanksgiving!

V. A Life of Thanksgiving for Christ's Redemptive Work

- A. Paul returns to christ's redemptive work (vv12-14)
 - 1. Note the emphasis on Christ's salvific work
 - 2. We have been rescued & saved!
 - 3. We have been taken from darkness into light!

- 4. We are forgiven and have a great inheritance!
- B. The more we see and know this we are changed!
 - 1. We become grateful to God for salvation
 - 2. We begin to live to please Him

VI. Applying the Word

- A. Are we growing in the knowledge of God?
 - 1. This is essential for believers!
 - 2. If we do not grow in knowledge we do not grow!
 - 3. Are we faithful in the Word?
 - 4. Are we faithful on Sunday? In small group?
 - 5. Without these things we will not grow!
- B. Are we living worthy of the Lord?
 - 1. Are our lives being changed to be like Jesus?
 - 2. Are we bearing fruit of good works?
 - 3. Are we enduring in obedience?
 - 4. Are we joyful, thankful people?
 - 5. If we are weak in one area ask God to grow there!
- C. Communion strengthened by the gospel
