## II. The Servant Song of Isaiah

- A. Isaiah's prophetic book 3 major sections
  - 1. The early prophecy chapters 1-35
  - 2. The historical hinge chapters 36-39
  - 3. The prophecy to the future exiles chapters 40-66
    - a. Our text is in final section spoken to exiles
    - b. These people were living in darkness & despair
    - c. All hope seemed to be lost or is it?
    - d. Our text speaks of the "servant" (Isaiah 42:1) Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him and he will bring justice to the nations. Isaiah 42:1
- B. The "Servant Songs" of Isaiah

- 1. Texts in Isaiah 40-66 speaking of servant of Yahweh
- 2. "servant" occurs 5x in chapters 1-39; 22x in 40-66
- 3. Who is the servant of Yahweh?
  - a. Cyrus, king of Persia [Isaiah 41:1-2; 45:1-4]
  - b. Israel God's people (Isaiah 41:8-9) But you, O Israel, my servant, Jacob, whom I have chosen, you descendants of Abraham my friend, 9 I took you from the ends of the earth, from its farthest corners I called you. I said, 'You are my servant'; I have chosen you and have not rejected you. Isaiah 41:8-9
    - 1. Israel is the servant here, the chosen one
    - 2. But in Isaiah 53, Servant dies for Israel
    - 3. Someone beyond Israel is the true Servant
  - c. Jesus the Anointed One/Messiah/Christ True Servant
    - 1. He is the only one who can restore Israel to God
    - 2. He is the True Israel, the True Servant
- C. The Servant of Yahweh in Isaiah 42:1-4 Jesus
  - 1. The NT tells us it is Jesus
    - <sup>18</sup> "Here is my servant whom I have chosen, the one I love, in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him, and he will proclaim justice to the nations. <sup>19</sup> He will not quarrel or cry out; no one will hear his voice in the streets. <sup>20</sup> A bruised reed he will not break, and a smoldering wick he will not snuff out, till he leads justice to victory. <sup>21</sup> In his name the nations will put their hope." Matthew 12:18–21
  - 2. Work of Servant here can only be done by Jesus
  - 3. I taught on this before see website for this text

## III. The Servant & His Work

A. The Servant - He serves Yahweh

Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him and he will bring justice to the nations. Isaiah 42:1

- "MY servant"; I uphold; MY chosen one; I delight; MY Spirit
- 2. This is Servant of Yahweh He does Yahweh's work
- B. The Servant's Work
  - 1. The focus of the servant's work justice

    Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one
    in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him and he
    will bring justice to the nations. <sup>2</sup> He will not shout or
    cry out, or raise his voice in the streets. <sup>3</sup> A bruised
    reed he will not break, and a smoldering wick he will
    not snuff out. In faithfulness he will bring forth
    justice; <sup>4</sup> he will not falter or be discouraged till he
    establishes justice on earth. In his law the islands
    will put their hope." Isaiah 42:1–4
    - a. His work is referred to as justice three times
    - b. It also references his law basis of justice
    - c. This Servant comes to bring justice right wrongs
    - d. This Servant will see justice done evil punished
    - e. This Servant will see justice done right prevails
    - f. If we know ourselves this might not produce hope!
  - 2. The manner of the Servant's work gentleness Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him and he

will bring justice to the nations. <sup>2</sup> He will not shout or cry out, or raise his voice in the streets. <sup>3</sup> A bruised reed he will not break, and a smoldering wick he will not snuff out. In faithfulness he will bring forth justice; <sup>4</sup> he will not falter or be discouraged till he establishes justice on earth. In his law the islands will put their hope." Isaiah 42:1–4

- a. He establishes real justice gently
- b. The Servant does not break bruised reeds
- c. The servant does not extinguish flickering flames
- d. He treats us with great gentleness
- e. This takes great time, but He is not discouraged
- f. Thanks be to God Jesus is gentle with us
- g. But justice will be established all will be corrected
- 3. The outcome of the Servants work hope
  Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one
  in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him and he
  will bring justice to the nations. <sup>2</sup> He will not shout or

  - a. In his law/Torah/instruction the islands put their hope
  - b. His instruction brings true justice with gentleness
  - c. Though all seems dark He brings the light of hope to open eyes that are blind, to free captives from prison and to release from the dungeon those who sit in darkness. Isaiah 42:7

- d. The Servant's work restores hope for us!
- 4. The scope of the Servant's work the whole world he will not falter or be discouraged till he establishes justice on earth. In his law the islands will put their hope." Isaiah 42:4
  - a. Islands translated by LXX as 'Gentiles'
  - b. This is major point in passage
     I will keep you and will make you to be a covenant for the people and a light for the Gentiles, Isaiah 42:6
  - c. The Servant comes for Israel and us!
  - d. God's mercy is thrown open for pagan Gentiles!
  - e. This is a basis for hope!

## IV. Applying the Word

- A. The prophet's song of hope resonates through our carols
  - O Come O Come Emmanuel
     O come, O come, Emmanuel,
     And ransom captive Israel,
     That mourns in lonely exile here
     Until the Son of God appear.

Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

O come, Thou Rod of Jesse, free Thine own from Satan's tyranny; From depths of hell Thy people save, And give them victory over the grave.

O come, Thou Day-spring, come and cheer Our spirits by Thine advent here; Disperse the gloomy clouds of night, And death's dark shadows put to flight.

O come, Desire of nations, bind In one the hearts of all mankind; Bid Thou our sad divisions cease, And be Thyself our King of Peace.

  - 1. He has come to bring hope to us
  - 2. You may feel exiled from God so was Israel
  - 3. Your sins may have separated you from God He restores us gently
  - 4. You may feel like a bruised reed, flickering flame He will not put you out
  - Reject Consumer Christmas it can not fill the void or set you free
  - 6. Embrace the Advent of Hope! Christ has come!
