

# WE FAIL JESUS, JESUS DOES NOT FAIL US

## **We Fail Jesus, Jesus Does Not Fail Us**

### **Key idea:**

Jesus does not, will not, fail us, he holds us through all our trials. He pursues us and holds our relationship with him. NOT US! Him!

### **Key text:**

Luke 22:31-34, 54-62

31 “Simon, Simon, Satan has asked to sift all of you as wheat. 32 But I have prayed for you, Simon, that your faith may not fail. And when you have turned back, strengthen your brothers.” 33 But he replied, “Lord, I am ready to go with you to prison and to death.” 34 Jesus answered, “I tell you, Peter, before the rooster crows today, you will deny three times that you know me.”

54 Then seizing him, they led him away and took him into the house of the high priest. Peter followed at a distance. 55 And when some there had kindled a fire in the middle of the courtyard and had sat down together, Peter sat down with them. 56 A servant girl saw him seated there in the firelight. She looked closely at him and said, “This man was with him.” 57 But he denied it. “Woman, I don’t know him,” he said. 58 A little later someone else saw him and said, “You also are one of them.” “Man, I am not!” Peter replied. 59 About an hour later another asserted, “Certainly this fellow was with him, for he is a Galilean.” 60 Peter replied, “Man, I don’t know what you’re talking about!” Just as he was speaking, the rooster crowed. 61 The Lord turned and looked straight at Peter. Then Peter remembered the word the Lord had spoken to him: “Before the rooster crows today, you will disown me three times.” 62 And he went outside and wept bitterly.

### **Key points:**

1. In Luke 22:31-34, Satan wants to destroy Peter and Jesus knows Peter will deny him.
2. Peter fails and we will fail Jesus.
3. Peter quickly repents.

4. Jesus fails no one. His perfect life, burial, and resurrection have paved the way for us to enter into Him. We are part of God's family because of Christ - nothing we have done.

**Questions for discussion/application:**

1. What part of Sunday's text and teaching stood out most to you? Why?
2. Why do you think Peter was so confident that Satan could not affect him? Do you ever have those thoughts?
3. Are we ever overconfident in our own abilities and/or talents? Do we allow status or position to influence us to lean on our talents?
4. How do the other Disciples react toward Peter's denial? When we are wronged by someone how do we react?
5. What is Peter's almost immediate response to his sin? How do we respond when we sin? Are we quick to seek repentance and forgiveness?
6. How does Jesus treat Peter after the betrayal? Are we able to forgive? Do we forgive quickly and completely? Is there someone you need to forgive?
7. Is there a difference in Peter's betrayal and Judas' betrayal?
8. Do you firmly, without doubt, believe that Jesus will not fail you?
9. Can you think of someone with whom you can share what you have learned this week? Pray for them and ask God to open a door for you to share His Word this week.
