- B. Who serves ?everyone!
 - a. We ALL have spiritual gifts
 - b. God has blessed every person he created
 - "Whatever gift" it can be something very simple does not have to be complex or on a grand scale.
 - ii. How we use those gifts should be for God.
 Colossians 3:23–24 (ESV) tells us that
 everything we do should be for Christ:
 "Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the
 Lord and not for men, knowing that from the
 Lord you will receive the inheritance as your
 reward. You are serving the Lord Christ."
 - c. You must embrace his gift
 - i. "You have received" When you receive a gift you must accept it, embrace it, use it for its potential.
 - d. God wants you to use his gifting
 - i. "Faithful stewards of God's grace" Any gift or talent that you have is authored or authorized by God! Understand that your abilities are God given not of yourselves. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works. Hebrews 10:24 God has given YOU a gift/talent with the purpose of YOU using it to serve one another ultimately serving HIM. Use the gift he has given you correctly (have you ever tried eating soup with a fork? Or hammering a nail with a screwdriver?)
 - e. You must LOOK to serve others (by serving Jesus)
 - i. Find ways to help
 - ii. Be active in looking
 - iii. Be connected to your local church.

C. How we Serve?

- a. Just like the video we watched earlier, right?
 - i. Stay at home watch church on a screen,
 - ii. be critical on everything that doesn't suit you
 - iii. Worry or dwell on what's happening after church whether it be lunch, football, or both!
- b. "If anyone serves, they should do so with the strength God provides"
 - i. Serve with the strength that God provides
 - "The struggle is real"-(and so is Satan)
 -sometimes it is hard to get motivated.
 You have a hard week then on the "one
 day that you don't have to do anything"
 you have Sunday school. God provides
 you the talent and the strength, you
 are just giving it back!
 - 2. God gives you a complete gift and the power to operate it. (christmas toy with no batteries)
- c. When we serve do it with a right spirit
 - Serving with a disgruntled unhappy heart or from "duty"
 - Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it. Proverbs 4:23
 - 2. If you serve because "you should help out" not because you want to there is no benefit.
 - ii. Serving with a joyful heart

So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith. Galatians 6:10

- iii. When we serve it gives us a more natural interaction with people a chance to know who they really are.
- d. When is it enough-- NEVER
 - i. "Faithful stewards" (revist)
 - 1. When we are young
 - 2. When we are old
 - 3. Where we are right now don't wait for the "right season of life" serve now, serve always!

 - b. In our community. (christians need to be active in the real world)

 - 4. County Fair outreach booth
 - 5. Events like these not in our church
 - c. Local church where we are in community "connected" with the local body.
