

Growing Generous

Key idea:

As those who are cared for and blessed by God, we should develop a heart that is generous towards others in thought and action, willing to help in whatever way we can.

Key text:

Proverbs 11:24-26

One man gives freely, yet gains even more; another withholds unduly, but comes to poverty.

A generous man will prosper; he who refreshes others will himself be refreshed. People curse the man who hoards grain, but blessing crowns him who is willing to sell.

Key points:

- 1. Scripture teaches that generosity and stinginess both have clear, predictable results in the lives of those who practice them (Proverbs 11:24-26; 17:5; 19:17; 21:13; 22:9; 22:22-23; 28:8; 28:22; 28:27; Psalm 41:1; 112:5; Ecclesiastes 5:13; Isaiah 58:6-12; Luke 6:38; 1 Timothy 6:18-19).
- 2. Scripture commands us to be generous with our money and possessions, especially with those who are poor or vulnerable (Proverbs 11:24-26; 14:21; 14:31; 22:9; 28:27; Leviticus 23:22; Isaiah 58:6-12; Ezekiel 16:49; 1 Timothy 6:18-19; James 1:27; 1 John 3:17-18).
- 3. Scripture commands us to be generous with our time and talents, using them to serve others (Exodus 23:4-5; 1 Timothy 6:18-19; James 1:27).
- 4. Scripture commands us to develop a generous attitude and spirit, not one that is mocking or cruel (Proverbs 11:25; 14:21; 17:5; 19:17; 21:13; Isaiah 58:9-10; Ezekiel 16:49; Zechariah 7:10; Matthew 5:7; Acts 20:35; Romans 12:15; 14:3-4; 14:10-13; 1 Corinthians 13:7; Galatians 6:1; James 1:27).
- 5. Scripture commands that we must be generous in how we develop our society and also the way we conduct our business (Proverbs 11:26; 22:22-23; 28:8; Leviticus 23:22; Deuteronomy 24:12-13; 24:14; 24:19; Psalm 112:5; Zechariah 7:10; James 1:27)

- 6. Scripture commands us to be generous in forgiveness to others (Proverbs 10:12; 17:9; Matthew 5:7; Luke 6:37; 17:4; Galatians 6:1; Ephesians 4:32; Colossians 3:13)
- 7. Scripture commands us to be generous in our prayer for others, even our enemies (Luke 6:27-28; 23:34; Acts 7:60)
- 8. The basis for our generosity is the Gospel, and God's generous grace given to us.

Questions for discussion/application:

- 1. What part of Sunday's text and teaching stood out most to me? Why?
- 2. Was I surprised to see how much Scripture speaks of generosity in my treatment of others? Have I ever heard much about this before?
- 3. How do I initially respond to people who are generous and kind to me? What is my initial response to those who are stingy or mean-spirited to me? What does Luke 6:37 tell me I should expect to see in this regard?
- 4. When I consider the six areas of generosity listed above, which one do I sense the Holy Spirit showing me that I struggle with the most? Why do I struggle with growing generous in this area?
- 5. How can I draw upon the Holy Spirit's power to grow generous in the area I identified in question 4?
- 6. When I consider our culture at present, do I think we are growing more generous, or more hard-hearted toward one another? Why? What can I do to encourage others to grow generous in attitude and action?
- 7. Why is the Gospel the key for me to grow generous? What specific ways has God been generous to me? How should I think and act in light of this?
- 8. Whom can I pray for, share what I have learned, and invite to church this week?
