  - 1. Theme: The Gospel of justification by faith alone was not of human origin, but was revealed by God directly to Paul.

  - Theme: Paul was called as an Apostle to the Gentiles, and as such speaks with the full authority of Jesus Himself.

- 1. Theme: Paul and the other Apostles were united in their understanding of the Gospel and supported one another in their call.

- E. Paul, Peter, and Justification by Faith Alone
  - Theme: Paul had to rebuke Peter at Antioch because his actions were undercutting the heart of the Gospel of justification by faith alone.
  - 2. Text: Galatians 2:11-16
  - 3. Reading: Acts 15:5-11

# II. The Benefits of the Gospel: Received by Faith Alone

- A. Justification by Faith Alone
  - 1. Theme: God declares us to be righteous, not because of our works, but because of the work of Christ in our behalf, which we receive through faith alone.
  - 2. Text: Galatians 2:15-16
  - 3. Reading: Philippians 3:1-11

#### B. Dead to the Law But Alive to God

- 1. Theme: We have died to the law but become alive to God, living a new life by faith in Christ.
- 2. Text: Galatians 2:17-21
- 3. Reading: Romans 7:1-6

#### C. The Blessings of Faith

- Theme: Through faith in Christ we are redeemed from the curse and receive all of the blessings of God.
- 2. Text: Galatians 3:1-14
- 3. Reading: Romans 4:1-8

# D. The Superiority of Promise Over Law

- 1. Theme: The law is inferior to God's promise and therefore we should look to God in faith, rather than relying on the law.
- 2. Text: Galatians 3:15-25
- 3. Reading: Romans 4:13-17

#### E. Heirs of God Through Christ

- 1. Theme: Through Christ, believers are the heirs of all God's covenant blessings.
- 2. Text: Galatians 3:26-4:7
- 3. Reading: Romans 8:12-17

#### F. Excursus: Paul's Ministry to the Galatians

- 1. Theme: Paul's ministry to the Galatians provides an excellent model for Christians today as they lead others.
- 2. Text: Galatians 4:8-20
- 3. Reading: 1 Thessalonians 2:7-12
- G. Children of Slavery, Children of Promise
  - 1. Theme: The true seed of Abraham are those born of the Spirit and promise, while those trusting in law are merely slaves.
  - 2. Text: Galatians 4:21-31
  - 3. Reading: Psalm 87

#### III. How Should We Then Live?

- A. Our Freedom in Christ
  - 1. Theme: Christ came to give us true freedom, the ability to be who we were created to be the image of God, serving others in love.
  - 2. Text: Galatians 5:1-13
  - 3. Reading: Romans 6:15-23

## B. Walking by the Spirit

- 1. Theme: The Spirit enables us to live a Christlike life, helping us to overcome the flesh in a way the law never could.
- 2. Text: Galatians 5:16-26
- 3. Reading: Romans 8:1-11

#### C. Keeping In Step With the Spirit

- Theme: As those made alive by the Spirit, we must keep in step with the Holy Spirit, developing a close, personal relationship with Him.
- 2. Text: Galatians 5:25
- 3. Reading: John 15:1-8

#### D. The Life of Freedom in the Spirit

- 1. Theme: Our life of freedom in the Spirit is one of personal responsibility and mutual care, looking forward to our final reward.
- 2. Text: Galatians 6:1-10
- 3. Reading: Romans 15:1-6

# E. The Centrality of Christ

- Theme: Christ is central to the Gospel and true life, and we must proclaim Him as Paul did.
- 2. Text: Galatians 6:11-18
- 3. Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:18-31
