 - 1. Command to praise/give thanks to the Lord
 - 2. Recite history as reason for praise/thanks
 - a. Often called great wonders
 - b. Sometimes God's creative acts
 - c. Sometimes God's covenant with David
 - d. Usually God's acts of salvation

 - iii. It is eternal, enduring forever

 - 1. Give thanks to the Lord (vv1-3; 26)
 - a. One of most common forms of command

- i. Psalms 106:1; 107:1; 118:1-4
- ii. 2 Chron 5:13; 7:3; 20:21
- b. 4 here identical except replace name with titles
- 2. God's mighty acts of creation (vv4-9)
 - a. Genesis terminology (spread out; great lights; govern)
 - b. Wisdom terminology (understanding; Pr 3:19)
 - c. God's hesed seen in great, wise, creative acts
- 3. God's mighty acts of salvation (vv10-22)
 - a. Exodus event
 - i. Plagues
 - ii. Red Sea crossing
 - iii. Wilderness guidance & victories
 - b. God's hesed seen in great acts of salvation
- 4. God's mighty acts today (vv23-25)
 - a. Shift in syntax, person
 - b. Now looking at God's actions today
 - c. Even giving food: providence
 - d. God's hesed seen in big & small events today

- ✓ Command to give praise/thanks to the Lord
- Recitation of God's past actions as a reason for praise/thanksgiving
 - Often called 'great wonders'
 - Sometimes God's creative acts
 - Sometimes God's covenant with David
 - Usually God's acts of salvation

Give thanks to the LORD, call on his name; make known among the nations what he has done. 2 Sing to him, sing praise to him; tell of all his wonderful acts. 3 Glory in his holy name; let the hearts of those who seek the LORD rejoice. 4 Look to the LORD and his strength; seek his face always.
