  - 2. The Davidic shepherd (Ezek 34:23)
  - 3. Result: people keep law (Ezek 37:24)

  - 1. Genesis 1:26-28 Man is to rule
  - 2. Psalm 8:3-8 Man's glory is to rule

# III. The Need for the Great King

- A. Kings of Israel/Judah failed (Ezek 22:26-28; 2 Ki 17:21-22)
  - 1. Like prophets & priests, kings/officials failed (Ez 22:27)
  - 2. Kings led Israel into sin (2 Ki 17:21-22)
- B. The people did not follow Torah (2 Ki 17:21-22)
  - 1. Followed leaders into sin
  - 2. Did not keep God's law
- C. The people did not become 'kings'
  - 1. Did not fulfill their call
  - 2. Still doing what was right in own eyes (Jd 21:25)
- D. Prophecies of the coming King (v 1; Dan 7:13-14)
  - 1. King would sit on God's throne (110:1)
  - 2. Kind is David's Lord! (110:1)
  - 3. King is given everlasting authority (Dan 7:14)

## IV. Jesus is the Great King

- A. He fulfills prophecies
  - 1. He sits on David's throne (Luke 1:32)
  - 2. He is the Son of David (Matt 21:4-9)

- 3. This King must be praised (Lk 19:37-40)
- 4. The prophecies were all fulfilled in Him (Lk 19:41-44)
- B. He succeeds where others failed
  - 1. He rules from God's throne (Heb 1:3)
  - 2. He kept the law perfectly (Mt 5:17)
  - 3. He shepherds God's people (John 10:11)
  - 4. He extends the kingdom (Mt 28:18-20)
- C. He has made His people kings!
  - 1. We are a royal priesthood (1 Peter 2:9)
  - 2. We are kings/kingdom (Revelation 1:6)
  - 3. We are to extend his rule (Mt 28:18-20)
