- A. Have been looking at strong families
- B. Divorce is a tough topic
  - 1. Not pleasant to talk about
  - 2. Goes against spirit of age no fault divorce
  - 3. A lot of divorced Christians!
  - 4. A lot of disagreement among Christians
- C. What does the Scripture teach on divorce & remarriage?
  - 1. A lot of texts; can't cover all in 2 weeks
  - 2. We will try to look at highlights of this doctrine

## II. The Pharisees Test & Jesus' Response

- A. Some Pharisees wanted to test Jesus
  - 1. They wanted to trap him
  - 2. Debate over divorce in Judaism
  - 3. No win situation for Jesus
- B. "Lawful to divorce any and every reason?"

- 1. Dt 24:1 see back for literal rendering
- 2. Hillel any reason; Shammai adultery
- 3. Who is right? Rules for divorce?
- C. Back to Genesis (vv4-5)
  - 1. Original text on marriage
  - 2. Marriage two become one
- D. Implication two are one; don't divide
  - 1. No longer two one!
  - 2. Implication don't divorce
  - 3. Marriage God's work; divorce man's

## III. Why Does Divorce Exist?

- A. Pharisees Why did Moses command divorce?
  - 1. Referring to Deut 24:1-4
  - 2. Was Moses wrong?
- B. Jesus Moses **permitted** because hard hearts
  - 1. Permitted not commanded
  - 2. Permitted because of hard hearts
  - 3. Not God's design though

4. We will look at possible exceptions next week

## IV. Confronting Our Culture of Divorce

- A. Recognize we live in a divorce saturated culture
  - 1. About 40% of marriages end in divorce<sup>1</sup>
  - 2. Exact percentages debated but divorce is common
  - 3. We see and hear of it everywhere
  - 4. Relatively little social stigma/pressure any more
- B. Recognize we live in a no fault divorce culture
  - 1. All states, most with no wait period
  - 2. Some states don't allow "fault" divorces!
  - 3. Three primary causes
    - a. No right or wrong quick, no thought divorce; success (Pitt)
    - b. False 'tolerance' no one held accountable
    - c. False 'freedom' isn't free others pay (Betts; study)
- C. Recognize the tragic results of this mindset
  - 1. A steep price is paid for this 'freedom' (Betts)
  - 2. Lingering effects of divorce on kids (study)

- 3. No wonder God hates divorce (Mal 2:16)
- D. The solution guard yourself to not break faith
  - 1. Too much divorce in church! Buying the lies! (Poll)
  - 2. We must strive to build strong marriages
    - a. Seek God as to whether called to single or marriage
    - b. Carefully, prayerfully choose our mate
    - c. Work to build a strong, biblical marriage
      - i. Purposes
      - ii. Roles
      - iii. Communication, dating, romance, etc.
  - 3. We must encourage one another to stay together

- Grown children of divorce say no such thing as good divorce
- Say they spent a lot of time alone
- Say they feel emotional distance from parents
- Children often pawns in struggle between parents
- Even in amicable split, kids live in 2 worlds

Poll by Religion & Ethics NewsWeekly 71% of Americans believe in ideal of lifelong marriage 22% believe divorce is a sin 52% - divorce can be best solution if problems can't be worked out

34% of evangelicals believe divorce is sinful 30% of Catholics believe divorce is sinful
