## II. The Paradoxical Basis of Godly Ministry

- A. Paul the slave of God (v1a)
  - 1. Paul is the slave of God (v1a)
  - 2. δοῦλος normally slave not servant
  - 3. Paul has given up all rights owned by God
- B. Paul the commissioned apostle
  - 1. Paul is an apostle of Christ (v1a)

- 2. Paul entrusted to preach (v3)
- 3. Paul apostle by God's command (v3)
- 4. Paul has authority in the church

## III. The Goals of Godly Ministry

- A. To encourage faith in the elect
  - 1. For the faith of the elect (v1b)
  - 2. Here faith refers to trust not creed
  - 3. The righteous live by faith (Rom 1:17)
  - 4. Impossible to please God without faith (Heb 11:6)
  - 5. Call to faith, and strengthen faith
- B. To encourage knowledge of the truth
  - 1. For the knowledge of the truth (v1c)
  - 2. This the knowledge of what is believed (creed)
  - 3. We must hold to THE faith (1 Tim 6:20-21; Jude 3)
- C. To encourage godliness
  - 1. This truth leads (accords with) to godliness (v1c)
  - 2. Truth leads to godly conduct (2:11-12; Rom 12:2)
  - 3. Creed I did not make it, it is making me

- D. To encourage the hope of eternal life
  - 1. "upon the hope of eternal life" (2a) NIV too loose
  - 2. Built on the fact that God cannot lie (2)
  - 3. This is built on God's eternal promise (2b)
  - 4. Hebrews 6:18-20; 1 Clement 27:3

## IV. Conclusion & Summary

  - 1. Do not settle for less beware itching ears!
  - 2. We all need a full orbed training plan
  - 3. Includes affective, cognitive, behavioral
  - 4. Are you looking for & receiving all three?
