II. Key NT Words for Church Leaders

- A. Three main words (presbuteros, episcopos & poimen)
 - 1. "elder" (πρεσβύτερος) v5; Acts 20:17
 - 2. "overseer" (ἐπίσκοπος) v7; Acts 20:28; 1 Tim 3
 - 3. "shepherd/pastor" (ποιμήν) Eph 4:11
- B. Three words one office (Titus 1:5-7; 1 Pet 5:1-2; Acts 20:17,28)

III. Elders - A Team of Pastor-Leaders

- A. Elders a team of leaders
 - 1. Appoint elders in each town (v5) note plural
 - 2. Elders almost always plural (61x vs. 5x)

- 3. Note plural when used of church leaders
 - a. Acts 11:30; 14:23; 20:17; 1 Tim 5:17; James 5:14; 1 Peter 5:1
 - b. Acts 20:28; Phil 1:1 all plural!!!
 - c. Singular are example of group (generic) v7
- 4. Note: not necessarily co-equality primus inter pares
 - a. Not every elder is equally gifted or mature
 - b. "First among equals" is a valid concept
 - c. But still function as a team not rubber stamp
- B. Elders a team providing pastoral care
 - 1. Pastoral terms Acts 20:17,28; 1 Pet 5:1-4
 - 2. Elders keeping watch over souls (Heb 13:17 ESV)

IV. Thinking Biblically About Church Leaders Today

- A. The importance of team leadership
 - 1. This is not the model of most churches
 - 2. Many churches pastor = Pope or dictator
 - 3. Plurality is NT model and should be followed
 - 4. More men = more gifts, time, care
 - 5. Protection from the sins of leaders
- B. The importance of pastoral leadership

- 1. Elders are pastoral leaders spiritual
- 2. They take care of souls not church "business"
- 3. Just like Acts 6 we need others to take care of other issues
- C. Responding and helping the elders
 - 1. Are you praying for all the elders, or just one?
 - 2. Do you receive from all the elders?
 - 3. Are you using your gifts, so elders can use theirs?
