II. The Pure Gospel

- A. To the pure those cleansed by Christ
 - 1. Speaking of those morally pure before God
 - 2. They are cleansed by Christ
 - a. NT Titus 2:13-14; 1 John 1:7-9; Acts 15:7-11
 - b. OT as well Heb 9:11-14; Ps 51:1-7
 - 3. Pure Gospel internal; external.; confess/faith
 - a. Recognize sin is internal not from external objects
 - b. Recognize solution is from outside themselves
 - c. Confess sin and look to Christ in faith
- B. All things pure no ceremonially unclean objects

- 1. Speaking of ceremonial purity
- 2. Nothing is impure/outlawed ceremonially
 - a. Mark 7:18-19; Rom 14:14,20; 1 Cor 10:25-26
 - b. No object is inherently impure

III. The Corrupt Teaching

- A. Those who are corrupted not cleansed by Christ
 - 1. Speaking of those not cleansed by Christ
 - 2. They try to cleanse themselves unbelief
 - a. v15; 1 Tim 4:3; Mark 7:5-7; 14-15; 18-23
 - 3. Corrupt teaching sin external; I correct; works
 - a. They think sin is external; solution in themselves; works!
 - b. Exact opposite of the pure Gospel!
- B. Nothing is pure they defile everything!
 - 1. Nothing is pure for them! (v15)
 - 2. Even they are corrupt! (v15)
 - 3. In fact, they defile all they touch! (v16; Hag 2:13-14)

IV. Corrupt Teachings & Pure Gospel Today

A. Do we recognize corrupt teachings today?

- 1. Teachings that minimize our sin problem
- 2. Teachings that blame our sin on others (Henry quote)
- 3. Teachings that offer solution other than the Gospel
- 4. These will not heal our true disease!
- B. Do we recognize and embrace the true Gospel
 - 1. Our problem is **sin** not something else
 - 2. Our problem is **our** sin not others sin
 - 3. The only solution to our problem is Christ!
- C. Do we recognize corrupt teachings are powerless before sin?
 - 1. They can't remove guilt and punishment of sin
 - 2. They can't deal with sin's power (Col 2:20-23; Google trends)
 - 3. Gospel deals with guilt, punishment, & power!

The Pure Gospel vs. Corrupt Teachings Titus 1:15-16 May 28, 2006 ???? 1 Thessalonians 5:23-24 7 But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin. 8 If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. 9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. 1 John 1:7-9

1 Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions. 2 Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin. 3 For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me. 4 Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight, so that you are proved right when you speak and justified when you judge. 5 Surely I was sinful at birth, sinful from the time my mother conceived me. 6 Surely you desire truth in the inner parts; you teach me wisdom in the inmost place. 7 Cleanse me with hyssop, and I will be clean; wash me, and I will be whiter than snow.
