#### II. Called To Be Good Citizens

- A. Called to submit to the government
  - 1. Subject to rulers & authorities (v1)
  - 2. Common teaching (v1; Rom 13:1; 1 Pet 2:13-14)
- B. What we owe the government
  - 1. Honor & respect (1Pe 2:17)
  - 2. Recognition God's servant (Rom 13:4)
  - 3. Submission & obedience (v1; Rom 13:1-2)
  - 4. Taxes (Rom 13:6-7)
  - 5. Good works of citizenship (v1b)
- C. The limits of obedience (Acts 5:29)
  - 1. As always, obedience to God is primary
  - 2. Be careful not a license for rebellion!

### III. Called To Be Good Neighbors

- A. Called to be good neighbors (v1b-2)
  - 1. Do good works for others (v1b)
  - 2. Peaceful relations w/ others (v2)
- B. Our responsibility for peaceful relations
  - 1. If possible, depends on us (Rom 12:18-19)
  - 2. Called to peace not belligerence

#### IV. The Basis & Power – The Gospel

- A. Remember what you were (v3)
  - 1. A terrible picture! (v3)
  - 2. It may describe our leaders, neighbors!
- B. Remember how God treated you (v4)
  - 1. God was kind and loving (v4)
  - 2. He showed this while we were sinners (Rom 5:8)
- C. Remember the basis for salvation: God's merciful work
  - 1. Not our works his mercy (v5)
  - 2. Not our works his work (v5)
- D. The outcome of the faith good works!

- 1. Those who trust God, devote to good works (v8)
- 2. Even if people are ungrateful/wicked like we were!

## V. Conclusion & Summary

Titus 3:1-8 July 2, 2006 Communion

Hebrews 13:20-21 paraphrase

1 Everyone must submit himself to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God.

Romans 13:1

13 Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every authority instituted among men: whether to the king, as the supreme authority, 14 or to governors, who are sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right.
