II. Two Phases of God's Creative Work

- A. Phase one God created ex nihilo
 - 1. "In the beginning" (Gen 1:1; Jn 1:1)
 - 2. ex nihilo without pre-existing material
 - a. Necessitated by biblical concept of God (wk 1)
 - b. John 1:1,3; Col 1:16; Heb 11:3
 - c. God spoke "Let there be"; Ps 33:6,9
- B. Phase two God formed the universe
 - 1. A formless universe is now "formed"
 - 2. Genesis 1:2-3; 9; 11; 2:7 more next week

III. Two Realms of God's Creative Work

- A. The two realms: heavenly and earthly
 - 1. Not really Gen 1:1; but is Col 1:16
 - 2. Col 1:20; Eph 1:10; Mt 6:10
 - 3. Heaven God's throne; earth physical universe
- B. Creation is both realms not one or the other
 - 1. God's creative work entails both realms
 - 2. God's plan and our future entail both

IV. Two Aspects of God's Creative Work

- A. Aspect one spiritual entities
 - 1. Col 1:16; Psa 148:2,5; Heb 1:14; Mat 8:16
 - 2. Includes angels, Satan and his demons
- B. Aspect two physical entities
 - 1. Gen 1:1; Col 1:16; light; sky; ground; plants, animals
 - 2. Most of creation falls into this category
- C. Man: The spiritual-physical being
 - 1. Man alone is both spirit & physical (Gen 2:7)
 - 2. To be man, must be both spirit and physical
