  - 1. It displays God's glory (Ps 19:1; Is 40:25-26)
  - 2. It displays God's wisdom & power (Jer 10:12; Rom 1:20)

- 1. It shows us the glory of God (Ps 19:1-4; Rom 1:19-20)
- 2. Creation reminds us to worship (Ps 8:1-4)

  - 1. Creation is handiwork of God! (litter, waste)
  - 2. Creation is revelation of God! (pay attention)
- B. Do we learn from creation?

  - 1. God brought creation from tohu wabohu to blessed
