I. Introduction – The Unique Place of Man

A. Mankind is uniquely spiritual-physical

1. Universe is a spiritual-physical creation (Col 1:16)
2. Man is spiritual-physical being (Gen 2:7)

B. Mankind alone is the image of God

1. Man created in God's image (Gen 1:26-27)
2. Man like God and represents God

II. God's Call for Mankind

A. Mankind alone is called to rule creation

1. God planned for man to rule creation (Gen 1:26)
2. God commands man to rule creation (Gen 1:28)
3. Ruling creation is man's glory (Psalm 8)
4. Mankind is God's vice-regent over creation

B. The aspects of mankind's rule over creation

1. Rule (רָדָה) and subdue (vכִּיבֵד) – 1:26,28

- a. Rule can be used harshly, neutrally, or gently
- b. Subdue – overcoming; put in subjection
- c. Rule gently but firmly; note of opposition (Satan?)

2. Work (עָבַד;) and care for (שָׁמַר) - 2:15

- a. Work – till; serve; priestly service
- b. Care for – guard/protect; keep commands
- c. Ross quote

3. Name the animals – 2:19

- a. Naming implies authority over the animals
- b. Quote for *Dictionary of Biblical Imagery*
- c. Dylan – Man Gave Names to All the Animals

III. Mankind: Forming & Filling the Universe

A. God formed and filled the universe

1. Chart from Genesis 1
2. God formed and filled; last act was man

- B. God calls man to continue work of forming & filling
 - 1. Fill the world (1:28); after the flood (Gen 9:1,7)
 - 2. Form the creation (1:26-28; 2:8, 15)
 - 3. Note problem in Genesis 2:4-5 – unproductive
 - 4. The problem: no rain, no man – Gen 2:4-5
 - 5. God's solution – create man – Gen 2:5, 7

- C. Mankind: Forming the Creation Under God
 - 1. This is God's intent for His image – His work
 - 2. We are to unlock, form, and lead creation

IV. Applying the Word

- A. Do you see our call to fill, rule, and form this world?
 - 1. This is God's first call to us as humans
 - 2. Humans are integrally related to this earth
 - 3. Christians are still human!
- B. Do you see the firm foundation this gives for education?
 - 1. Science, math, literature, phys ed work with creation

- 2. We don't create – we discover

- C. Do you see that work is important to God?

- 1. Work existed prior to the fall!
- 2. Your work is important to God – vocation

- D. Do you see this fulfilled in Christ?

- 1. Christ is the 2nd Adam (Rom 5; 1 Cor 15)
- 2. Christ – Creator, Reconciler, Ruler (Col 1:15-20)
- 3. Come to His Table! – the Lord's Supper

God's Call for Mankind

Genesis 1:26-28; 2:4-7; 2:15

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Communion

Hebrews 13:20-21

16 For by him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things were created by him and for him. Colossians 1:16

5 You made him a little lower than the heavenly beings and crowned him with glory and honor. 6 You made him ruler over the works of your hands; you put everything under his feet: 7 all flocks and herds, and the beasts of the field, 8 the birds of the air, and the fish of the sea, all that swim the paths of the seas. Psalm 8:5-8

These two verbs are used throughout the Pentateuch for spiritual service. “Keep” is used for keeping the commandments and taking heed to obey God’s word; “serve” describes the worship and service of the Lord, the highest privilege a person can have. Whatever activity the man was to engage in in the garden... it was described in terms of spiritual service to the Lord. (Ross, 124)

Adam’s commission to “name” engages him in what we have come to call science but what the ancients knew as wisdom. To know is to name; to name is to know and express the essential nature of someone or something. *Dictionary of Biblical Imagery*
