  - 1. Life is from Christ, in Christ, to Christ
  - 2. Service (vv20-22) Exalt in body; fruitful labor
  - 3. Necessity of remaining (vv24-26) progress, joy, boasting
- C. To die is gain to be with Christ ultimate goal
  - 1. Yet our true goal is beyond this life, die is gain
  - 2. Exalted in our death (v20)
  - 3. A hard choice??!! (vv22-23)
  - 4. With Christ best option (vv22-23)
