II. God's Call - Shema and Great Command

- A. The Shema v4
 - 1. Memorable but not easy to translate! (NIVmg)
 - 2. Key ideas YHWH Covenant God; monotheism
 - 3. No capricious multitude of god YHWH alone
- B. Great command love God with all (v5)
 - 1. Basic command love God Himself
 - 2. Extent with everything in me (v5; Mk 12:30)
 - 3. Implication not external legalism but full love

III. Our Personal Response

- A. Commands on the heart (v6)
 - 1. God's Word must be on our heart (v6)
 - a. Not just external take into heart

- b. Meditate, memorize, internalize
- c. Can't love God apart from His Word
- B. The law and the Gospel God's call to us
 - 1. Meditate on Word we can't obey its laws
 - 2. Great command love God with everything always
 - 3. Problem we don't and can't!
 - 4. Legalism reduce call to manageable level
 - 5. Gospel forgiveness, changed heart
 - 6. John Newton Lot Us Love & Sing & Wonder

IV. Our Responsibility - Reach Next Generation

- A. Impress the commands on children (v7)
 - 1. Literally 'recite again and again'
 - 2. Many times, places, ways (v7b-8)
 - 3. Both family and community (v9)
- B. Multi-Generational Perspective of Scripture
 - 1. Psalm 78:5-6 4 generations!
 - 2. Psalm 78:6-7 shepherd heart, not actions

V. Applying the Word

- A. Do I see the need for Christ?
 - 1. I can not keep Great command need grace!

- 2. Christ kept it for me look to Him
- 3. Remember Newton's hymn!
- B. Do we see the great command?
 - 1. The great command is to love God with all
 - 2. Do I love God or just keep rituals?
 - 3. Do I love God with every part emotions, mind, body?
 - 4. Does this love lead me into Word? It must!
- C. Am I reaching future generations?
 - 1. Parents training children?
 - 2. Grandparents training 3rd generation?
 - 3. All helping them see Christ everywhere?

Reaching Future Generations

Deuteronomy 6:4-9 July 20, 2008 Water Baptism Numbers 6 ²⁸ One of the teachers of the law came and heard them debating. Noticing that Jesus had given them a good answer, he asked him, "Of all the commandments, which is the most important?"
