    - a. Eph 5:18-21 Spirit filled; teach, sing, submit
    - b. Rom 12:16 live in harmony
    - c. Eph 4:32 kind, compassionate, forgiving
    - d. Heb 13:17 obey, submit; they keep watch

  - 3. Analogy sponge in bucket of water
- C. Am I walking unity with the local church?
  - 1. Can't fulfill many commands apart from LC
  - 2. Remember means of grace/Spirit filling happen in LC
