## II. OT Background: Moses and the Veil

- A. Not like Moses who put on veil (v13)
  - 1. Moses face radiant after Sinai (Ex 34:29-30)
  - 2. Covered face with veil (Ex 34:33-34)
  - 3. Unveiled before Lord, veiled with people
- B. Veil over unbelievers minds/hearts (2Co 3:14-15)
- C. Conversion: Christ removes veil (2 Co. 3:14-16)
- D. Spirit gives freedom from veil and law (2Co 3:17)

## III. The Spirits Transforming Work

- A. We **all** have unveiled faces now (v18a)
  - 1. Greek is emphatic we ALL unveiled faces
  - 2. Only Moses went before God like this (Num 12:6-8)

- B. We all behold God as in a mirror (2 Cor 3:18a)
  - 1. NIV reflect; KJV/NASB behold mirror
  - 2. κατοπτρίζω behold as in mirror usually
  - 3. Corinth mirrors 1 Cor 13:12; 1Clem 36:2
  - 4. We do not see God directly yet but as in mirror
- C. We are being transformed into His likeness (v18c)
  - 1. Word used 4x Mt 17:2/Mk 9:2, Rom 12:2
  - 2. We begin to bear God's glory increasingly
- D. Transformation is a process as we behold His glory
  - 1. Ever increasing glory (v18d)
  - 2. Beholding in mirror & transformed present ptc
  - 3. Will be completed future 1Co 13:12; 1Jn 3:2; Ro 8:18
  - 4. Bodies transformed Phil 3:21
- E. The is the Spirit's work (2Co 3:18e)

## IV. Applying the Word

- A. Do we see the veil that blinds unbelievers?
  - 1. There is a veil over minds and hearts
  - 2. Has Christ taken away the veil for you?
  - 3. Turn to Him for true freedom today!
- B. Do we see glory & privilege we have in New Cov?

- 1. Only Moses saw we all see
- 2. The glory we behold & receive is greater
- 3. Moses' glory faded ours grows
- 4. Thanks be to God for this!
- C. Are we beholding God's glory daily?
  - 1. Transformation is a process
  - 2. Only happens as we regularly behold His glory
  - 3. Mirror Word, sacraments, means of grace
  - 4. Do we behold Him regularly in Word, prayer, fellowship?
  - 5. Do we behold Him as we gather together?
  - 6. Come and behold His glory at the table
  - 7. Come and be transformed!

Transformed by the Spirit 2 Corinthians 3:12-18 February 1, 2009 Communion 1 Thessalonians 5:23-24//1 Timothy 1:17 <sup>29</sup> When Moses came down from Mount Sinai with the two tablets of the Testimony in his hands, he was not aware that his face was radiant because he had spoken with the LORD. <sup>30</sup> When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, his face was radiant, and they were afraid to come near him. Exodus 34:29-30
