 - 1. This is the content of his Gospel (v1)
 - 2. This is what early Christians received (v1)
 - 3. This is what early Christians held on to (v1)
- B. This is the only Gospel all other is false
 - 1. This Gospel has power to save (v2)
 - 2. All others Gospels can not save (v2)
 - 3. The primacy of the Gospel (v3)
 - 4. We must hold to the true Gospel
- III. The Events of Holy Week
 - A. The death of Christ for our sins

- 1. Christ died for our sins (v3)
- 2. Paid price for our sins (Is 53:5; 1 Pet 2:24)
- 3. In death He bore God's wrath for us!
- 4. This fulfilled Scripture (v3; Lk 24:46-47)
- 5. This was no mistake God's eternal plan
- B. Christ's burial tasting death for all
 - 1. He was buried (v3)
 - 2. Certainly included for evidence of real death
 - Show Christ tasted death for us (Heb 2:9)
- C. Christ's bodily resurrection conquering death
 - 1. He was raised from the dead (v4)
 - 2. According to Scripture (v4; Acts 2:31)
 - Bodily Scripture (Acts 2:31; Gnostics; skeptics)
 - 4. Seen by witnesses (v5-8; Acts 2:32)
 - 5. He has conquered death!

- A. Do we have faith in the Good News of Holy Week?
 - 1. Judith Warner celebrate but not believe Passover & Easter
 - 2. This is not Gospel it is real facts, real history
 - 3. Gospel says if not real history no value at all
 - 4. It calls for real faith in real events, real Person
 - 5. He offers life to us if we believe
- B. Do we give thanks to God for Good News of Holy Week?
 - 1. We were sinful Christ has died!
 - 2. We were slaves to death He has conquered!
 - 3. Give thanks to Him for life!
