# IV. Isaiah's Difficult Commission

- A. Difficult message always but never (v9)
  - 1. Intensive infinitive absolute after finite verb
  - 2. He knows they will not listen
  - 3. Michael Card The Prophet (chorus)
- B. The terrible effect of Isaiah's words
  - 1. Harden, dull, close them completely (v10)
    - a. Completely heart, ears, eyes chiasm
    - b. Active you make them hard (hiphil impv)
    - c. LXX translation to ease this hard saying
    - d. NT quotes both ways
      - 1. MT John 12:40
      - 2. LXX Mat 13:14-15; Acts 28:26-27
  - 2. The reason for this hardening effect
    - a. God's mysterious sovereignty (hymn)
    - b. Their hearts will not respond to truth
    - c. Shadow of response to Christ/Gospel in NT
    - d. Preaching will get a response good or ill
    - e. Shows truth may not be compromised for response

  - 1. Until the exile land empty, forsaken
  - 2. Even the tenth tithe, holy laid waste
  - 3. This is a hard word
- C. A final ray of hope
  - 1. The remnant will be stump for future growth
  - 2. Key theme in Isaiah, prophets, Scripture

#### VI. Applying the Word - Isaiah's Commission & Ours

- A. Do we hear God's call for messengers of Gospel?
  - 1. He does not send seraphim or angels
  - 2. He looks for men and women to take Gospel
  - 3. Do we respond like Isaiah? here am I, send me!
- B. Do we see the call is faithfulness not acclaim?
  - 1. Do we see God told Isaiah most would reject?
  - 2. Do we see Jesus said narrow gate and way?
  - 3. Do we see we must still bear witness of Christ?
  - 4. Isaiah knew they would reject and still did!
  - 5. Do I long for faithfulness or acceptance?
