 - a. Isaiah, Micah or common source?
 - b. Can't know inspired by God!
 - 2. A vision of the distant future (v2)
 - a. It shall come to pass ESV
 - b. In the last days points to Messianic age
 - 1. Can simply mean future days (Num 24:14)

- 2. Can be TT for Messianic age (Hos 3:5; Acts 2:17)
- 3. 2:2 Messianic apocalyptic language; key theme

- a. Mountain of temple Zion exalted
- b. Heb אים chief or highest/top I think chief
- c. Raised above the hills homes of gods
- d. A great reversal Zion small mountain!
- e. YHWH recognized as supreme God

4. A vision of nations turning to YHWH (v2-3)

- a. All nations stream to Zion! (v2)
- b. Psalm 87 Foreigners born/home in Zion!
- C. Nations on pilgrimage (v3; Psa 122:1; Zec 8:20-23)
- d. True worship Come; YHWH, Jacob; walk, Torah
- e. Supernatural river of nations flow uphill; Word causes
- f. Fulfilled in church Gal 4:26; 1 Pet 2:6-7; Heb 12:22-24

- c. Will only be consummated at 2nd coming

- D. No fatalism we must walk to be part of this

 - 6. Do we trust God's Word & Spirit to do impossible?
 - 7. Do we look to the future with faith not fear?

Now I am going back to my people, but come, let me warn you of what this people will do to your people in days to come. Numbers 24:14

Afterward the Israelites will return and seek the LORD their God and David their king. They will come trembling to the LORD and to his blessings in the last days. Hosea 3:5

'In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams. Acts 2:17

I myself am going.' 22 And many peoples and powerful nations will come to Jerusalem to seek the LORD Almighty and to entreat him." 23 This is what the LORD Almighty says: "In those days ten men from all languages and nations will take firm hold of one Jew by the hem of his robe and say, 'Let us go with you, because we have heard that God is with you.' " Zechariah 8:20-23
