Theme: God's promise to be with us, which was typified by many people and events in the Old Testament, is ultimately fulfilled in Jesus Christ, who is Immanuel, God with us.

- B. He reiterates in 8:1-10
- C. In all three chapters the birth of a child central
- D. Who is this child? More than one child?

II. A Virgin Conceives - The Meaning of Almah

- A. A virgin will conceive Isaiah 7:14
 - 1. Virgin will conceive NIV and most translations
 - 2. Young woman will conceive RSV
 - 3. Hebrew words almah and bethulah
 - a. Similar words; some say almah not virgin
 - b. However Gen 24:43 almah=virgin
 - c. Generally young unmarried women = virgin!
 - d. LXX translated almah as parthenos virgin
 - e. Matthew 1:23 quotes LXX, clearly virgin
- B. Conclusion: Almah can be a virgin

III. Children - And THE Child

A. Isaiah's children in these passages

- 1. The time element in 7:14-17
- 2. Maher-Shalal-Hash-Baz Isaiah 8:3-4
- 3. Maher-Shalal-Hash-Baz Isaiah 8:7-10
- 4. Isaiah and children signs from God Isa. 8:18
- 5. Isaiah's children seem to be a fulfillment
- B. Yet a greater Child will come
 - 1. A virgin will conceive (v14)
 - 2. The name Immanuel GOD with us
 - 3. The names and nature of this Child (9:6-7)
 - a. Isaiah's children and Hezekiah can NOT fulfill
 - b. Looks to a Divine Child GodMan
- C. The nature of biblical types and shadows
 - 1. This is common in OT type awaits Reality
 - 2. Abraham's seed Gen 12:7; Gal 3:16
 - 3. Prophets & Prophet Deu 18:15-19; Jn 1:45; Heb 1:1-2
- D. OT shadows point to Christ the Reality!!

The Sign of Immanuel - God With Us

Isaiah 7:13-17; 8:1-10; 9:1-7 Matthew 4:12-17 June 21, 2009 Communion 2 Corinthians 13:14 Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, a young woman shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel. Isaiah 7:14 RSV

See, I am standing beside this spring; if a maiden comes out to draw water and I say to her, "Please let me drink a little water from your jar," Genesis 24:43

"The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel"--which means, "God with us."

Matthew 1:23

The LORD appeared to Abram and said, "To your offspring I will give this land." So he built an altar there to the LORD, who had appeared to him. Genesis 12:7

The promises were spoken to Abraham and to his seed. The Scripture does not say "and to seeds," meaning many people, but "and to your seed," meaning one person, who is Christ.

Galatians 3:16

The LORD your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among your own brothers.
