- A. A strong call to come (v1-2)
 - 1. Ah, you who are thirsty come to true water (v1)
 - 2. Note repetition of 'come'; also 'listen'
 - 3. This feast is free! (v1) paid by Servant (ls 53)
 - 4. False feasts (v2)
 - 5. This is idolatry in all its forms (Chap 41ff)
 - 6. The true feast that satisfies the soul (v2)
- B. A firm promise to those who come (v3-4)
 - 1. If you listen and come you will live (v3)
 - 2. I will make a covenant with you hesed (v3)
 - 3. A covenant based on Servant (vv3-5)

- a. Note shift to 'him', then to singular 'you'
- b. Note call to lead Gentiles Servant
- c. Like Isaiah 49:7

III. A Call to Repent

- A. A call to repent and seek the Lord (vv6-7)
 - 1. Note both turn from & turn to repent, believe
 - 2. Note surety of God's mercy, abundant pardon
 - 3. Note urgency while He may be found
- B. Why we need to repent contrasting man & God
 - 1. Ways, thoughts contrast, chiasm (vv7-9)
 - 2. Repent, for ways/thoughts not like God's
 - 3. An immeasurable distance heaven & earth (v8-9)
 - 4. Assurance of God's mercy (v7, 10-11)
 - 5. Great encouragement God's powerful Word!
 - 6. Rain powerful many things also God's Word!
 - 7. God's Word able to soften hard hearts, change, give life!

- B. A future of obstacles removed exiles return (v12)
- C. Creation celebrates consummation! (v12; Rom 8:18-21)

V. Applying the Word

- A. Do we see the great gulf between God and us?
 - 1. His ways are not our ways!
 - 2. His thoughts are not our thoughts!
 - 3. This is true of all of us not someone else
 - 4. God calls for us to repent & turn to Him
- B. Do we turn to other sources for satisfaction?
 - 1. Where do I try to find deepest satisfaction?
 - 2. Idols of money, prestige, sex, entertainment, friends?
 - 3. Do we see these will never truly satisfy?
 - 4. Look to Christ for true, deep, lasting satisfaction!
- C. Do we see the power of God's Word?
 - 1. Do we see it can change us? Our desires?
 - 2. Do we regularly receive God's Word?
 - 3. No Word = seek satisfaction from idols
 - 4. Receive God's powerful Word!
 - 5. Speak God's powerful Word to others!
 - 6. More powerful than false food & drink!
