II. Suffering For Being A Christian

- A. The suffering in view is persecution/ridicule
 - 1. Insulted because of the name of Christ (v14)
 - 2. Suffering is largely verbal, but becoming more
 - 3. Is not talking about normal difficulties of life
- B. Suffering for being a Christian
 - 1. Share in suffering of Christ (v13)
 - 2. Not salvific because of Him; like Him
 - 3. Insulted because of name of Christ (v14)
 - 4. Not because of bad behavior, but Christ (v15)
 - 5. That is just punishment not suffering
 - 6. Meddler, busybody trying to run other lives
 - 7. Suffer as a Christian (v16)
- C. Suffering in 1 Peter

- 1. Not the troubles of this life
- 2. Not result of bad behavior on our part
- 3. Persecution for being a Christian & following God

III. A Christian Response to Suffering/Persecution

- A. Don't be surprised (v12; v4, 14); not strange
- B. Recognize suffering is part of our calling (v13, 19)
 - 1. Sufferings of Christ; will of God (v13, 19)
 - 2. Matt 10:24-25; Joh 15:18-21; 1Jo 3:13
- C. Rejoice glory is coming! (v13)
 - 1. Rejoice???? (v13)
 - 2. Share Christ's sufferings and glory (v13-14)
 - 3. Principle suffering then glory (1:6-7; 1:11; Lk 24:)
- D. Judgment begins with church (v17; [Ezek 9:5-6])
 - 1. No surprise God's method starts with church
 - 2. Rejoice shows glory is coming!
 - 3. Rejoice ungodly lost and not saved (v17-18)

IV. Applying the Word - Suffering As A Christian

- A. The ultimate Christian response!!! v19 3 parts
- B. Do we suffer according to God's will?
 - 1. Not for our poor behavior in spite of good

- 2. Do we understand that this is our time of suffering?
- 3. Do we expect to be ridiculed or are we surprised?
- 4. Bad theology or expectations lead to bad response
- C. Do we entrust ourselves to our Faithful God?
 - 1. Do we know that God is faithful?
 - 2. Do we know He will keep His covenant?
 - 3. Do we know He has told us truth eternity!
 - 4. Do we entrust ourselves to Him to do with as He sees fit?
- D. Do we continue to do good?
 - 1. Do we do good to those who speak evil?
 - 2. Do we do good even if we are punished for it?

V. Communion - Entrusting Ourselves to God

- A. Here we are reminded of God's faithfulness in the past
- B. He we are reminded of God's promises for the future
- C. Here we entrust ourselves to God

Suffering As A Christian 1 Peter 4:12-19 Psalm 31:1-5 August 22, 2010 Communion Romans 15:13 1 Peter 4:12-19 Dear friends, do not be surprised at the painful trial you are suffering, as though something strange were happening to you. 13 But rejoice that you participate in the sufferings of Christ, so that you may be overjoyed when his glory is revealed. 14 If you are insulted because of the name of Christ, you are blessed, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you. 15 If you suffer, it should not be as a murderer or thief or any other kind of criminal, or even as a meddler. 16 However, if you suffer as a Christian, do not be ashamed, but praise God that you bear that name. 17 For it is time for judgment to begin with the family of God; and if it begins with us, what will the outcome be for those who do not obey the gospel of God? 18 And, "If it is hard for the righteous to be saved, what will become of the ungodly and the sinner?" 19 So then, those who suffer according to God's will should commit themselves to their faithful Creator and continue to do good.
