II. Key Principles About Government

- A. Government is ordained by God
 - 1. Established, instituted by God (v1-2)
 - 2. God's servant (vv 4,6)
 - 3. Rooted in Gen 9:5-6
 - a. God demands account (v5)
 - b. But man executes punishment (v6)
 - c. Probably goes back to Gen 4 with Cain
- B. Government not a particular form is ordained
 - 1. Does not say what type just government
 - 2. v1 no authority except established by God

- 3. v1 authorities that exist established by God
- 4. No particular form is more biblical than another
- 5. Kings specifically mentioned many times!
- 6. Democracy is not the biblical form but I like it!
- C. Governments primary task is justice & order
 - 1. v3 called to punish evil, reward good
 - 2. v4 bears sword, agent of wrath, punish wrong
 - 3. Gen 9:6 punish murder as image of God
 - a. Punish because murder is destroying image of God
 - b. Punish because as image of God we can judge
- D. Government is a good thing in this fallen world
 - 1. v4 (ESV) God's servant for our good
 - 2. 1 Tim 2:1-4 gov't gives quiet, peaceful life
 - 3. Remember Nero is the Emperor when this was written!
 - 4. "Tyranny is better than anarchy" (Calvin Daniel commentary)
- E. Government is subject to God's authority
 - 1. v1 established **by God** under His authority
 - 2. v4, 6 God's servant He is the Master
 - 3. Government may not disobey God
 - 4. Government may not call evil good, dark light
- F. Christians have responsibilities to the government

- 1. vv1-2 submit to government; rebellion against God
- 2. Titus 3:1 be subject to rulers, obedient
- 3. 1 Tim 2:1 pray for them
- 4. vv6-7 taxes, honor, respect OWED
- 5. Acts 4:19-20 the limit don't disobey God
- 6. This limit is not a cloak for rebellion!
- G. Government is part of the common kingdom of man
 - 1. It arises from the Noahic covenant common
 - 2. It purpose only needed in this age not eternity
 - 3. It is very distinct from redemptive kingdom
 - a. Comprised of all people vs believers only
 - b. Concerned with justice vs grace, forgiveness
 - C. Temporary peace, partial justice vs eternal, complete
 - d. Will cease to exist but KOG is eternal.

- A. Do we see government as God's good gift to us?
 - 1. I know there are a lot of jokes here!
 - 2. It can be the gift that keeps on giving!
 - 3. Tevya could you bless someone else?
 - 4. But government is a gift from God!
 - 5. Do we see how bad anarchy is and how govt restrains it?

- 6. Try visiting other countries disorder, corruption
- B. Do we see the limits of government?
 - 1. It is part of common kingdom of man
 - 2. It is only one sphere among many in common kingdom
 - 3. This means it has limited purposes, abilities
 - 4. Do we act as if life depends on gov't?
 - 5. Do we act as those whose only citizenship is here?
 - 6. Too many Christians act like this is all there is
 - a. Gov't can not replace other spheres don't act like it can
 - b. Our real hope lies in God' and His kingdom
- C. Do we see our responsibility to government?
 - 1. Do we honor our leaders with our words?
 - 2. Even if we do not like them???
 - 3. Do we willingly give taxes as GOD commands?
 - 4. Do we submit to our leaders and laws?
 - 5. There is the exception but it is RARE
- 6. Do we pray for our leaders wholeheartedly? Giving Caesar His Due The Role and Limits of Government in Culture
