 - 1. Parents Joseph and Mary (vv4-5)
 - a. Simple people harried by empire concerns
 - b. Carpenter and young rural woman
 - 2. From Nazareth in Galilee (v4)
 - 3. A place of low reputation (John 1:46)
- B. Humble birthplace: Bethlehem
 - 1. Went to Bethlehem for census (2:4-7)
 - 2. Not Rome, or even Jerusalem Bethlehem
- C. Humble lodgings: the manger
 - 1. Laid in a manger (v7)

- 2. A place for cattle and their food not a baby
- 3. Have you ever been in a barn?
- 4. No room in the inn (v7)
- 5. Not poor planning by God humility
- D. Humble guests the shepherds
 - 1. Shepherds terrified by angel and glory (vv8-9)
 - 2. Angels message of good news of great joy (vv10-12)
 - 3. Message "to you" they are chosen witnesses
 - 4. Shepherds had once been held in honor
 - 5. David and the Lord (Psalm 23:1)
 - 6. By this time were often despised; lowest of peasants
 - 7. But God has chosen them to receive Good News
 - 8. But the message is "for all" (vv10-12)
 - 9. They will go & tell others as God's witnesses
 - 10. Like women after the resurrection

III. The Glorious Message of Christmas

- A. The message glory to God (vv13-14)
 - 1. This Child of such humility brings glory to God
 - 2. This Child allows us to bring glory to God

- B. The message peace to mankind (vv13-14)
 - 1. This Child has come that we might have peace
 - 2. Peace is offered to all regardless of station
 - 3. Peace shalom all is right whole, good, peace
 - 4. Glory to God and good for us go together

IV. Applying the Word

 - 1. Christ has come to offer peace
 - 2. The humility of Christmas shows none are too low
 - 3. The humility of Christmas shows none are too far

Luke 2:1-7 Advent Readings December 20, 2010 Prayer 1 Follow the way of love and eagerly desire spiritual gifts, especially the gift of prophecy. 2For anyone who speaks in a tongue does not speak to men but to God. Indeed, no one understands him; he utters mysteries with his spirit. 3 But everyone who prophesies speaks to men for their strengthening, encouragement and comfort. 4 He who speaks in a tongue edifies himself, but he who prophesies edifies the church. 5 I would like every one of you to speak in tongues, but I would rather have you prophesy.
