Title: Take Refuge In Christ

Theme: Refuge and security for eternity can be found only in Christ.

Text: Psalm 16

Reading:

Benediction: Hebrews 13:20-21

- I. (SLIDE 1) Introduction
 - A. We have only two choices in life that last an eternity
 - 1. to follow Christ
 - 2. or not to follow Christ
 - B. Our choice either brings refuge or rejection
- II. (SLIDES 2-4) Read Text
- III. (SLIDE 5) Christ Centered
 - A. Psalm 16
 - B. Messianic
- IV. (SLIDE 6) Safety and Refuge
 - A. No sense of distress in the Psalm
 - B. A plea for continued security.

- C. The Psalmist is laying claim to a promise and refuge the he can only find in God through the person and work of Christ.
- D. (SLIDE 7) Hebrews 6:16
 - We stand firm in our faith because of our unchangeable God.
 - In whom we place all of our hope upon our faith in the work and faithfulness of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.
 - 3. It is in this that we stand firm and secure.
 - 4. It is in this that our Psalmist seeks refuge.
- V. (SLIDE 8) Profession of Faith
 - A. An extension of the phrase "in you I take refuge."
 - B. A towering profession of faith in Yahweh, Yahweh is the Psalmists' "highest good."
- VI. (SLIDE 9) Refusal to Worship Other Gods
 - A. Two ways of interpreting verse 3
 - 1. Saints believers
 - 2. Saints Unusual Hebrew word, not used of worshippers of Yahweh, but of pagan deities.
 - 3. Delight negative contrast to verses 1 & 2
 - 4. Our heart has an unfortunate tendency to chase after false Gods from whom we must seek refuge and safety in Christ.

- B. (SLIDE 10) Their sorrows will increase
 - 1. Those who chase after false gods will have their sorrows increased.
 - 2. Sorrows we think emotional.
 - a) (SLIDE 11) used in Job 2:7 as loathsome sores
 - b) typically a physical ailment
 - 3. (SLIDE 12) eternal punishment not only spiritually separated from Christ but physically tormented as well.
- C. (SLIDE 13) | Will Not . . .
 - 1. I Will not . . libations of blood in pagan sacrifice
 - 2. (SLIDE 14) God commands not to partake in this way
 - 3. (SLIDE 15) I will not . . . take up their names (worship)
 - 4. (SLIDE 16) Yahweh is our portion and our cup
 - a) Fulfillment in Communion
 - b) As we experience grace in the sacrifice of Christ and in the continuing filling of grace through Communion we come to a greater understanding by that grace of the security in which we stand.
- D. (SLIDE 17) Commitment to Yahweh
 - 1. We rest assured in the promises of God

- 2. And the inheritance that he has promised.
 - a) (SLIDE 18) Our inheritance is sealed by the Holy Spirit
 - b) (SLIDE 19) We have been sealed by the Holy Spirit as heirs of God and co-heirs of Christ.
- 3. (SLIDE 20) The promises of God should lead us to praise and blessing of God.
 - a) as our counselor who leads us
 - b) every waking hour of our lives
- 4. (SLIDE 21) Yahweh is our guide
 - a) as the one before us Christ is the one who leads us to our ultimate destination
 - b) We will not be shaken because it is Christ who walks with us at our right hand.
 - c) (SLIDE 22) There is none who can shake use form the course God has called us.
 - d) As much Satan himself may condemn us, God declares us righteous in Christ and nothing can affect that not even our own unrighteousness.
- E. (SLIDE 23) Confidence and Joy in Yahweh
 - 1. Because of the secure foundation, the Psalmist sings out with a glad heart and a joyful tongue.

- 2. He sings joyously because he knows that not only is his soul secure in the hand of God but his physical body as well.
- 3. (SLIDE 24) Your Holy One
 - a) David knew that His Messiah would live eternally
 - b) And even though he may die that God would raise him from the dead just as God fulfilled with Christ.
- 4. (SLIDE 25) The Path of Life
 - a) The path the David speaks is an eternity with Christ.
 - (1) We will be filled with joy in the presence of Christ
 - (2) Vs. 8 Christ is the one who goes before and leads us at our right hand.
 - (3) In eternity with Christ we will be filled with eternal pleasures at the right hand of Christ our Lord.

- A. Do we rest secure?
 - 1. We do we find our security?
 - a) In ourselves
 - b) In others
 - c) In things of this world

- d) Or in Christ alone
