 - a. vs 6 Isaiah 28:16
 - b. vs 7 Psalm 118:22
 - c. vs 8 Isaiah 8:14
 - d. vs 9 Exodus 19:5; Isaiah 43:21
 - e. vs 10 Hosea 1:9-10; 2:23
 - 2. Context 1:23-25 the Word!
 - a. Born again through the Word
 - b. Quotes Isaiah 40:6-8 enduring Word
 - c. The Word preached

- 3. The call to proclaim the Word
 - a. Ezra 7:10 study, practice, teach Word
 - b. 1 Timothy 4:13 devoted to read, preach, teach
 - c. 2 Timothy 4:1-2 great charge preach Word
- 4. What it means to be biblically based
 - a. The Scripture is the final rule for faith & practice
 - b. Teaching Scripture is central in our worship
 - c. Teaching Scripture is central to shepherding

B. Christ centered

- 1. Note the central focus on Christ in the passage
 - a. vv4-6 Christ the Living, Precious Stone
 - b. vv7-8 Christ the Rock that divides humanity
- 2. Christ is foundation of Church & focus of Scripture
 - a. Christ is the foundation stone (vv6-7; 1 Cor 3:11)
 - b. Also Head of Body; Shepherd, etc.
 - c. Christ focus of Scripture (Jn 5:39; 2 Tim 3:15)
- 3. What it means to be Christ centered
 - a. Expository preaching, but also Christ centered preaching
 - b. The Church proclaims Christ not self-help tools
 - c. Worship, preaching, fellowship must be Gospel centric

C. Caring Community

1. Note we are being built together - community

- a. Built into a house/temple (1 Peter 2:4-5)
- b. Joined together, built together (Eph 2:20-22)
- 2. We need community for support & to live faithfully
 - a. Galatians 6:2 carry each others burdens
 - b. Hebrews 3:13 encourage; protect
 - c. 1 Peter 2:11 aliens and strangers need community!
- 3. What it means to be a caring community
 - a. We stress building relationships with one another
 - b. If a local church is not a community it is not really a church!
 - c. We urge everyone to build closely with others
 - d. This is why small groups are a BIG DEAL
- 4. This type of community limits how big BRCC can grow
 - a. The are advantages to growing big
 - b. Very hard for community can not happen in large churches
 - c. This is why we will plant rather than getting large
- D. Seeking to know Christ and make Him known
 - 1. God's people praising Him to others! (1 Peter 2:9)
 - 2. This is how BRCC seeks to know God
 - a. Biblically based we teach Scripture
 - b. Christ centered we focus on Christ, Gospel
 - c. Caring community we build together
 - 3. From this base, we praise Him to others
 - a. Are you experiencing God's amazing grace share it!

- b. Are you experiencing the joy of Christ share it!
- c. Are you grateful for the Gospel gossip it!
- d. God is good to us, among us invite others
