II. The Importance of Spiritual Gifts

- A. Spiritual gifts are an important topic in Paul's writings
 - 1. Rom 1:11; 12:4-8; 1 Corinth. 1:4-8; 7:7; Eph 4:7-16
 - 2. 1 Thess. 5:19-21; 1 Tim 4:14; 2 Tim 1:6
 - 3. Not to mention all of 1 Corinthians 12-14!!
- B. Yet, they were overlooked for much of Church history
 - 1. Growing clergy/laity distinction
 - 2. Virtually no discussion only clergy were gifted
- C. A great change but still problems
 - 1. Pentecostal and charismatic gifts front & center
 - 2. But often reduced to tongues or other 'miraculous'
- D. We want to give a brief but balanced view of gifts

III. Opening Up Spiritual Gifts

- A. πνευματικός spiritual 1 Corinthians 12:1
 - 1. Pauline term (24 of 26; 2x in 1 Peter 2:5; never in LXX)
 - 2. Relates to s/Spirit realm (Gal 6:1; Rom 1:11)
 - 3. Points to the spiritual source of something/someone
 - 4. Points to the crucial role of the Spirit in gifts
- B. χάρισμα gifts 1 Corinthians 12:4
 - 1. Pauline term (16 of 17; more than all other Greek writers)
 - 2. Built of the Greek word χάρις grace
 - 3. χάρισμα a concrete expression of grace
 - 4. Two categories
 - a. Gracious favor of God to individual or group
 - 1. Romans 6:23 gift of salvation
 - 2. This is 5 of 16 uses in Paul
 - b. Special gift allowing fulfill a particular function spiritual gifts
 - 5. Shows that gifts are based on God's grace
- C. διακονία service/ministry 1 Corinthians 12:5
 - 1. 1 Cor 12:5 parallel with χάρισμα
 - Common term for service/ministry
 - 3. Shows gifts are for the good of others ministry
 - 4. Shows gifts are not about me they are about others
- D. ἐνέργημα working 1 Corinthians 12:6
 - 1. 1 Cor 12:6 parallel with χάρισμα and διακονία

- Term for working/energy
- 3. Gifts are action not potential
- 4. Unused gifts are not really gifts!
- E. φανέρωσις disclosure/manifestation 1 Corinth. 12:7
 - 1. Only used 2 times (2 Cor 4:2; 1 Cor 12:7)
 - 2. Means to disclose or make manifest
 - 3. Gifts make grace & Spirit visible or concrete
 - 4. Gifts the Spirit works through us in visible way

VI. Defining Spiritual Gifts

- A. Key ideas from word study
 - 1. Gifts are empowered by Spirit "spiritual"
 - 2. Gifts based on the grace of God
 - 3. Gifts are to serve others
 - 4. Gifts are action not just potential
 - 5. Gifts make grace and Spirit visible
- B. Definition
 - 1. Theme statement
 - 2. This should govern our understanding of the gifts

III. Applying the Word

- A. Do we know that God wants to work through each of us?
 - 1. There is no special group of 'gifted ones'

- 2. All of us are gifted by the Spirit in different ways
- 3. God wants to work through you to serve others
- 4. Do you know the ways God most often works through you?
- 5. Are you looking for God to work through you daily?
- B. Are we keeping in step with the Spirit daily?
 - 1. The gifts are gifts of the Spirit
 - 2. He gives and empowers them we need Him
 - 3. Are we consciously seeking Him each day?
 - 4. Do we ask Him to work through us each day?
- C. Gifts of the New Covenant
 - 1. All of this is part of the new covenant
 - 2. No longer a special few all have the Spirit
 - 3. This is given to us by Christ
 - 4. Come to the Table and give thanks and receive!
