Theme: The Gospel of God's grace releases us from our chains of sin, and sets us free to live in the peace of God - no matter our circumstances.

#### I. Intro - A Series on Philemon

- A. How many have ever heard a series on Philemon?
- B. How many have heard even a single teaching?
- C. This is certainly a neglected book for many reasons
- D. It is a very small book 335 words on Greek
- E. It is a personal letter does it really apply to us?
- F. But it is an incredible story and full of the Gospel
- G. And it is full of Gospel applications for us
- H. So today we begin "Unchained"

#### II. Unchained - The Letter to Philemon

- A. A quick overview of the letter & its circumstances
  - 1. Paul is in chains a prisoner (v1, 9, 10, 23)

    Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus... <sup>9</sup> I then, as Paul

     an old man and now also a prisoner of Christ

    Jesus <sup>10</sup> I appeal to you for my son Onesimus,
    who became my son while I was in chains....

    <sup>23</sup>Epaphras, my fellow prisoner in Christ Jesus,
    sends you greetings. Philemon 1:1, 9–10, 23
    - a. Most likely either on way to Rome or in Rome
    - b. Some say Ephesus but no record of imprisonment there
    - c. Most likely in Rome reasons to be seen
  - 2. He is writing to Philemon, a church leader

Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus, and Timothy our brother, To Philemon our dear friend and fellow worker, <sup>2</sup> to Apphia our sister, to Archippus our fellow soldier and to the church that meets in your home: Philemon 1:1–2

- 3. Philemon probably lives in Colossae see below
- 4. Probably written at the same time as Colossians
  - a. Paul is in prison when writing both letters
  - b. Timothy is mentioned in both openings as "the brother"
  - Six people send greetings to Colossians; 5 of them also do to Philemon
  - d. Archippus only in Philemon 1:2 and Colossians 4:17
  - e. Onesimus only in Philemon and Colossians 4:9
- 5. This means Paul was probably in Rome chained to a guard when he wrote the letter to Philemon
- B. Why Paul wrote the letter to Philemon
  - Philemon owned a slave name Onesimus who ran away
  - 2. Onesimus ended up meeting Paul and converting
  - Paul is now sending Onesimus back with letter to Colossians - and to Philemon
     He is coming with Onesimus, our faithful and dear brother, who is one of you. They will tell you everything that is happening here. Colossians 4:9

I appeal to you for my son Onesimus, who became my son while I was in chains. <sup>11</sup> Formerly he was

useless to you, but now he has become useful both to you and to me. <sup>12</sup> I am sending him — who is my very heart — back to you. Philemon 1:10–12

### C. This is high drama!

- 1. A runaway slave returns how will the owner respond?
- 2. What will Paul say? How will he word it?
- 3. What will happen to Onesimus?
- 4. How does the Gospel apply to this????

### III. Paul - Unchained By Grace

- A. Paul is in physical chains
  - He mentions chains 4 times in this short letter
     Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus... <sup>9</sup> I then, as Paul
     — an old man and now also a prisoner of Christ
     Jesus <sup>10</sup> I appeal to you for my son Onesimus,
     who became my son while I was in chains....

     <sup>23</sup>Epaphras, my fellow prisoner in Christ Jesus,
     sends you greetings. Philemon 1:1, 9–10, 23
  - He does not use title of Apostle in intro chains Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus, and Timothy our brother, To Philemon our dear friend and fellow worker. Philemon 1:1
    - a. Almost always' Paul an apostle' or 'Paul a servant'
    - b. Only letter he opens this way stressing his chains
    - c. This 20% of Paul's references to being imprisoned in NT stressing it here
- B. Paul is in chains for Christ and the Gospel

Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus... <sup>9</sup> I then, as Paul — an old man and now also a prisoner of Christ Jesus .... <sup>23</sup>Epaphras, my fellow prisoner in Christ Jesus, sends you greetings. Philemon 1:1, 9, 23

- 1. Prisoner of Christ Jesus in chains for Gospel
- 2. The Gospel had put Paul in chains!
- C. Paul was unchained by the Gospel of God's grace & peace

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Philemon 1:3

- 1. This is a typical blessing in Paul's letters!
- 2. Not throwaway words the heart of everything
- 3. The Gospel tells us of the grace of God that saves
- 4. The Gospel gives us peace shalom with God
- 5. This Gospel had set Paul free from his sin
- 6. This Gospel had set Paul free from prejudice
- 7. This Gospel had given him peace with God and others
- 8. The peace of God reigned even when chained and facing death!
- 9. This Gospel had transformed the persecutor into the Apostle!
- D. Chained by man but Unchained by God!

  Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, descended from David. This is my gospel, <sup>9</sup> for which I am suffering even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But God's word is not chained. <sup>10</sup> Therefore I

endure everything for the sake of the elect, that they too may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory. 2 Timothy 2:8–10

- 1. Paul is in chains for the Gospel
- 2. But the Gospel God's Word is unchained!
- 3. Paul is willing to be physically chained so that other might be spiritually unchained
- 4. This is the power of the Gospel it breaks chains!

# IV. Unchained - To Apply the Word

- A. Have you been unchained by the Gospel of grace?
  - 1. This is the way to freedom!
  - 2. Real freedom does not come from us
  - Real freedom is not just choice but being restored to God
  - 4. Have you been unchained by grace?
  - 5. Look to Christ and be unchained!
- B. Have you been unchained by the peace of God?
  - 1. True peace does not shift with circumstances
  - 2. Paul had peace while in chains!
  - 3. Onesimus had fled his chains and still had no peace!
  - 4. Without the peace of God, we are still chained!
  - 5. Peace with God, others, circumstances flows from receiving and meditating upon the Gospel
