Theme: We must resist this fallen world, remembering that authentic, eternal life and joy Is found in God, not in this fading evil order of illusion that is passing away.

- D. "I thought that was what Marines did I did not know I had a choice!"
- E. Last time we saw our authentic inheritance in Christ
- F. Today how we live out of that how Christian's live
- G. Last week all perfect tense God's past actions
- H. This week present tense how we live now

### II. Do Not Love the World

- A. John's command Do not love the world??? Do not love the world or anything in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. 1 John 2:15
  - 1. John says to not love world or anything it it
  - 2. If we love the world, Father's love not in us
  - 3. But I thought God loved the world??

    For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. John 3:16
  - 4. How do we reconcile this? What does John mean?

- B. The meaning of "love" same as always in John Do not love the world or anything in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. 1 John 2:15
  - 1. Some think love has 2 different meanings
  - 2. Here it would refer to a selfish love
  - 3. But agape in John never has this idea
  - 4. Love has the same meaning in both places
- C. The meaning of world fallen, evil order opposed to God Do not love the world or anything in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. 1 John 2:15
  - 1. The word cosmos has many different meaning in NT
    - a. The created order, the earth and universe
       He was in the world, and though the world was made through him... John 1:10
    - b. The people who inhabit earth
       He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the sins of the whole world. 1
      John 2:2
    - c. The fallen, evil order opposed to God

They are from the world and therefore speak from the viewpoint of the world, and the world listens to them. 1 John 4:5

for everyone born of God overcomes the world. This is the victory that has overcome the world, even our faith. 1 John 5:4

- 2. John is referring to fallen, evil order opposed to God
  - a. This is by far most common meaning in John

- b. How he defines world lust, pride, not from God Do not love the world or anything in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. <sup>16</sup> For everything in the world—the cravings of sinful man, the lust of his eyes and the boasting of what he has and does—comes not from the Father but from the world. 1 John 2:15–16
- 3. We can not love the world and love the Father
- 4. We love the people trapped in the world system but hate the system

# III. Why We Must Not Love the Fallen World Order

- A. Nature of the world opposed to God

  Do not love the world or anything in the world. If
  anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in
  him. <sup>16</sup> For everything in the world... comes not from
  the Father but from the world. 1 John 2:15–16
  - 1. The world and the Father are diametrically opposed
  - 2. The world stands in opposition to our Father so we must oppose it, not embrace it
- B. Nature of world: lust, pride fulfillment apart from God For everything in the world—the cravings of sinful man, the lust of his eyes and the boasting of what he has and does—comes not from the Father but from the world. 1 John 2:16
  - 1. Note three (again!) temptations
  - 2. Literally lust of flesh, lust of eyes, pride of life
    - a. Lust of flesh our sinful cravings
    - b. Lust of eyes sinful desires for what we see
    - c. Pride of life boasting in what we have (apart from

#### God)

- 1. Other time bios used 1 John 3:17 possessions
- 2. NIV captures idea boasting in what we have and do
- 3. Unholy desire for what we do not have, unholy pride in what we do have
- 4. Key idea thinking we can find fulfillment, meaning, life apart from God
- 5. Probably an allusion to Genesis 3, Luke 4
  - a. Adam & Eve failed when tempted by lust and pride
  - b. Jesus faced these down as 2<sup>nd</sup> Adam and won!
- C. Nature of the world temporary illusion

  The world and its desires pass away, but the man who does the will of God lives forever 1 John 2:17
  - 1. The world promises life, joy, fulfillment forever
  - 2. But world can not deliver and it is only temporary
  - 3. But if we resist the world we find eternal joy
  - 4. This world is a fading illusion, but our faith provides authentic, eternal life and joy

## IV. Applying the Word

- A. Do we know the fallen world is hostile to God & church?
  - 1. Do not be deceived the world hates God
  - 2. Do not be deceived the world wants to destroy us
  - 3. Do not be deceived there is no compromise here
  - 4. The world will always try to deceive and seduce us

- 5. Do I understand this basic hostility in life?
- 6. Do I live like I understand it or that I expect the world to be essentially friendly to God?
- B. Do we give into the temptation of the world?
  - 1. Do I believe I can find fulfillment in something other than God?
    - a. What do I think would fulfill me if I could just get it?
      - 1. This is huge today whole economy built on this!
      - 2. Our culture has turned lust into a business!
      - 3. This is an idolatrous trap it never fulfills!
    - b. What do I have that I think is mine (pride of life)?
      - 1. This is huge in America self made man trap
      - 2. We find our identity in what we have & what we did
      - 3. But Christ is our identity not what we possess
      - 4. Any other view is idol worship
  - 2. Do I think this world's rewards are lasting?
    - a. Even if the world delivered it would not last
    - b. This world is a fading world passing away
    - c. This worlds pleasures and riches are fleeting
    - d. This is a world of temporary illusions a mirage
- C. Communion The Table of Authentic, Eternal Joy
  - 1. This Table points us to authentic joy, life, fulfillment
  - 2. This Table points us to Jesus where it all is found

- 3. These joys are not temporary and fading
- 4. These joys are lasting and growing
- 5. Come to the Table of Authentic, Eternal joy
