# I. Intro - The End of A Journey

- A. We have been looking at 7 titles of Christ in Isaiah
- B. These were all titles for the Messiah
- C. They were all titles the Church drew together in its worship during Advent
- D. The 7 O Antiphons one for each title
- E. Tonight O Emmanuel!

#### II. Emmanuel - God With Us

- A. The name Emmanuel means God With Us

  Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel. Isaiah 7:14
  - 1. Name formed from 3 Hebrew words God with us
  - 2. The Coming King will be none other than God With Us!
  - This is the stress in the opening lines of the Malcolm Guite poem
     O come, O come, and be our God-with-us
     O long-sought With-ness for a world without, Malcolm Guite - O Emmanuel
    - a. We seem to be without cut off
    - b. But Jesus is God with us, come to rescue us!

- c. What human hearts have longed for since the Garden of Eden, we are given in Christ!
- d. We need not be distant or cut off from God because Jesus is Immanuel God with us!
- B. Emmanuel God with us and for us!
  - 1. Emmanuel is not just God with us: He is God for us!
  - 2. The people in Isaiah's day feared the future and God's promise was Immanuel!
  - 3. God is not far off from our problems He has come to us in Immanuel, and He is with us and for us!
  - Immanuel does not come to bring judgment, but to offer God's Presence and blessing as we look to Him

### III. Emmanuel - The Completion of God's Promises

- A. Emmanuel the fullness of God with us
  - 1. Emmanuel brings all of the other titles home
    - a. He is God's Wisdom with us!
    - b. He is the Revelation of YHWH with us
    - c. He is the Promised Root of Jesse with us to sustain us
    - d. He is the Key of David with us to free us
    - e. He is the Dayspring of Light with us to pierce the darkness
    - f. He is the King of the Nations with us to rule and deliver us
  - 2. He is God Himself with us!

- B. The hidden acrostic in the O antiphons
  - 1. The church sang these the 7 nights leading up to Christmas Eve
  - 2. They sang 1 antiphon each night
  - 3. When you look back at the path of the antiphons, the first letter in Latin of each forms an acrostic
    - E Emmanuel (God With Us)
    - R Rex Gentium (King of the Nations)
    - O Oriens (Dayspring)
    - C Clavis (Key of David)
    - R Radix (Root of Jesse)
    - A Adonai (Lord)
    - S Sapientia (Wisdom)

Ero Cras - Tomorrow I Will Come!

- 4. Each year as the church celebrates, she reminds herself that "Tomorrow I will come"
- The journey is to remind us that wherever we may go, wherever we find ourselves - The King is Coming
- 6. The journey reminds us that God's people are never cut off from Him for Tomorrow I will come!
- 7. Like Israel re-enacted the Passover each year, entering into its reality afresh, so the church re-enacts the coming of Christ and salvation, entering into its reality afresh!

## IV. Receiving the Good News of the King

A. We have taken this journey to remind us that God is With Us!

- 1. When all seems confused, we can cry out to Him for Wisdom has come to us!
- 2. When we seem to have been forgotten and God seems distant and unknowable, we can call out to Him for YHWH is with us!
- 3. When life seems desolate, we feel like a tree cut down, we can have hope for the Root of Jesse is with us to sustain us!
- 4. When it feels like we are shut into a prison, or trapped in sin, we can call out for deliverance for He is the Key of David Who can unlock every door!
- When it feels all is dark, fear not for the Dayspring is rising, and His Light is with us to pierce the darkness
- 6. When it seems like God's plan has failed, rejoice, for He is the King of the Nations, and God's plan is right on time!
- 7. If you are God's Child, rejoice for Immanuel God is with us!
- B. Receiving and Passing on the Good News
