Theme: Adam's sin brought us slavery to death, but Jesus, the Second Adam, has conquered and gives freedom from death to His people through the resurrection.

I. Intro - What Will You Be Preaching On?

- A. Call from the Capital what is your topic?
- B. Obviously the Resurrection! But what about COVID?
- C. The reality of death is always there and answered!
- D. What does the resurrection of Jesus accomplish?
- E. How does this complete the biblical story and give us hope?

II. Created For Freedom and Life

- A. We were created to be the free rulers of creation
 - 1. We have seen this in Genesis 1-2
 - 2. If we would simply embrace the limits and commands of God, we would rule over everything When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, ⁴ what is man that you are mindful of him, the son of man that you care for him? ⁵ You made him a little lower than the heavenly beings and crowned him with glory and honor. ⁶ You made him ruler over the works of your hands; you put everything under his feet: ⁷ all flocks and herds, and the beasts of the field, ⁸ the birds of the air, and the fish of the sea, all that swim the paths of the seas. Psalm 8:3–8
 - a. A reflection upon Genesis 1-2 and our place
 - b. Despite our small stature, we were created for the glory and honor of ruling over all creation

- Paul says restoring this is what Jesus came to do
 For he must reign until he has put all his enemies
 under his feet... ²⁷ For he "has put everything under
 his feet." Now when it says that "everything" has
 been put under him, it is clear that this does not
 include God himself, who put everything under
 Christ. 1 Corinthians 15:25, 27
 - a. Paul is quoting Psalm 8 and says it is about Jesus!
 - b. What Adam messed up by his sin, Jesus came to restore
 - c. God still intends for humans to be free and rule over creation as His vice-regents.
 - d. Jesus has begun doing this already!
- B. The problem: the curse and death!
 - 1. Psalm 8 is a beautiful poem about the glory of humanity
 - 2. But it does not deal with the curse and death!
 - 3. This is why Paul says Jesus is putting the enemies under His feet He is taking back what was lost!

III. Death Through Adam, Life Through Christ

- A. Adam's sin of rebellion made us all slaves to death For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man. ²² For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive. 1 Corinthians 15:21–22
 - 1. Death came through Adam Genesis 2:15-17; 3:19
 - 2. Death did not just enslave Adam, but all humanity because we are all in Adam (also Romans 5:12-21)

- 3. We have made many scientific gains, but every one of us is enslaved by death.
- COVID has been a constant reminder of this over the past year, but the death rate will still be 1 per human even after COVID!
- B. Christ is the Second Adam Who reverses the curse So it is written: "The first man Adam became a living being"; the last Adam, a life-giving spirit. ⁴⁶ The spiritual did not come first, but the natural, and after that the spiritual. ⁴⁷ The first man was of the dust of the earth, the second man from heaven. 1 Corinthians 15:45–47
 - 1. The first Adam, the last Adam Jesus!
 - 2. The first Adam came from dust and then received his spirit; the Second Adam Jesus came from heaven and took our flesh
 - 3. To truly understand the work of Jesus, we must understand that He is the Second Adam, Who came to fulfill the obligations that Adam failed and to become the head of a renewed humanity!
 - 4. Jesus fulfilled Adam's obligations and exceeded Adam in every way!
- C. Death through Adam, life through Christ (2nd Adam)

 For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man. ²² For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive. 1

 Corinthians 15:21–22
 - 1. Note the clear parallel of contrast of two Adams
 - 2. The first Adam brought us slavery and death, while the Second Adam Jesus brings freedom and life!

- 3. Jesus tasted death so we might be freed from its power (Hebrews 2)
 - But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels, now crowned with glory and honor because he suffered death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone... ¹⁴ Since the children have flesh and blood, he too shared in their humanity so that by his death he might destroy him who holds the power of death that is, the devil ¹⁵ and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death. Heb 2:9,14–15
 - a. The writer is talking about Psalm 8 and the call for humanity to rule over all God created
 - b. He indicates we do not see this yet but we see Jesus Who has opened the way for this to happen!
 - c. To do this, Jesus came as a human, tasted and defeated death and the devil, and frees us!
- D. Jesus' resurrection guarantees our resurrection

 For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made
 alive. ²³ But each in his own turn: Christ, the firstfruits;
 then, when he comes, those who belong to him. 1
 Corinthians 15:22–23
 - 1. In Christ we WILL BE made alive future
 - 2. Jesus is the firstfruits of the resurrection, guaranteeing we will be raised
 - 3. This will happen when He returns

E. The Second Adam will subject everything to God as was intended from the beginning

Then the end will come, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father after he has destroyed all dominion, authority and power. ²⁵ For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. ²⁶ The last enemy to be destroyed is death. 1 Cor 15:24–26

- In the end, all will be subject to God through Jesus, the Second Adam
- He is presently doing this and will complete it when all of His people are raised and death is destroyed forever
- 3. God's plan to have humanity rule over all things to have them submit to God will be done!

IV. Applying the Word

- A. Am I in Adam or in Christ?
 - 1. Everything depends on which Adam I am in
 - 2. All of us are born in the first Adam and inherit slavery and death
 - 3. But through repentance and faith, we can be transferred into Jesus, the Second Adam, and receive freedom and eternal life!
 - 4. If you have never done so, look to Christ in faith today and receive eternal life and freedom!
- B. Christian celebrate victory over death!
 - 1. Jesus conquered death and gives His victory to us!
 - 2. We can have full confidence, faith, and hope in the face of death

Death, be not proud, though some have called thee Mighty and dreadful, for thou art not so; For those whom thou think'st thou dost overthrow Die not, poor Death, nor yet canst thou kill me.

- a. This should be our posture in the face of death!
- b. Jesus has conquered and we will rise!

- 2. Here we look forward to the return of Christ, our resurrection, and the marriage supper of the Lamb!
- 3. Come and let your soul feast at the Table of Life!
- D. Response Song: I will rise
