

A Father, A Son, and the Spirit

Key idea:

Paul writes to his spiritual son Timothy, fondly remembering his participation in the ancient faith and encouraging him to stir up the Spirit's Presence and gifts.

Key text:

2 Timothy 1:1-7

You then, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus. ² And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable men who will also be qualified to teach others. ³ Endure hardship with us like a good soldier of Christ Jesus. ⁴ No one serving as a soldier gets involved in civilian affairs — he wants to please his commanding officer. ⁵ Similarly, if anyone competes as an athlete, he does not receive the victor's crown unless he competes according to the rules. ⁶ The hardworking farmer should be the first to receive a share of the crops. ⁷ Reflect on what I am saying, for the Lord will give you insight into all this.

Key points:

- 1. Paul's opening words clearly display fondness and a close relationship with Timothy.
- 2. Paul's affection for Timothy is reinforced through his continual recalling of memories and his constant prayers for Timothy.
- 3. Paul encourages Timothy by reminding him of the deep roots of the faith, both in redemptive history and in Timothy's own family.
- 4. Paul reminds Timothy of the need to fan into flame the Spirit's Presence and gifts.
- 5. The Spirit works in believers to overcome fear and timidity, and to enable us to experience the power, love, and self-discipline needed to live faithfully in the midst of a hostile culture.

Questions for discussion/application:

1. What part of Sunday's text and teaching stood out most to me? Why?

- 2. Am I surprised that Paul begins a personal letter to his spiritual son with such a formal greeting? Why do I think he did this?
- 3. Why do I think Paul and Timothy developed such a strong bond with one another?
- 4. It has been said that every believer needs a Barnabas to walk beside them, a Paul to be a spiritual father, and a Timothy to help grow in the faith and carry it into the future. Can I name my 'Barnabas team'? A Paul? A Timothy?
- 5. What role does 'memory' or 'remembering' play in my spiritual life? What people and events can I bring to mind that encourage me and spur me on in my Christian life?
- 6. Why are the ancient roots of our faith so important? What is lost if I become unmoored from the history of God's people? How does the long history of the faith help me to stand firm in the face of opposition?
- 7. Why is it necessary for me to "fan into flame" the Spirit's Presence, gifts, and work in my life?
- 8. How do I "fan into flame" the Spirit's Presence, gifts, and work in my life? What practices do I personally find particularly helpful?
- 9. What is one thing I need to do this week to apply 2 Timothy 1:1-7 in my own life?
- 10. Who will I call to encourage this week? What specific members of BRCC will I commit before God to pray for and call?
