
- Lord, you have been our dwelling place in all generations.
- Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God.





- Let the favor of the Lord our God be upon us, and establish the work of our hands upon us; yes, establish the work of our hands!


