Key idea:

Man is made to glorify his maker. Man glorifies his maker by placing his mind on God and devoting his life to making disciples of Jesus Christ.

Key text:

Psalm 8 (NLT)

| Psa. 8:1 | O LORD, our Lord, your majestic name fills the earth! |

Key points:
