

Poems, Prayers & Promises

He will take pity on the weak and the needy and save the needy from death.


He will rescue them from oppression and violence, for precious is their blood in his sight.


¹ King Solomon, however, loved many foreign women besides Pharaoh's daughter-Moabites, Ammonites, Edomites, Sidonians and Hittites. ² They were from nations about which the Lord had told the Israelites, "You must not intermarry with them, because they will surely turn your hearts after their gods." Nevertheless, Solomon held fast to them in love.

1 Kings 11:1-8

³ He had seven hundred wives of royal birth and three hundred concubines, and his wives led him astray. ⁴ As Solomon grew old, his wives turned his heart after other gods, and his heart was not fully devoted to the Lord his God, as the heart of David his father had been.

1 Kings 11:1-8

⁵ He followed Ashtoreth the goddess of the Sidonians, and Molek the detestable god of the Ammonites. ⁶ So Solomon did evil in the eyes of the Lord; he did not follow the Lord completely, as David his father had done. 7 On a hill east of Jerusalem, Solomon built a high place for Chemosh the detestable god of Moab, and for Molek the detestable god of the Ammonites. 8 He did the same for all his foreign wives, who burned incense and offered sacrifices to their gods.

Solomonic Themes

- Verse 3, 6, and 7: Allusions to peace. Solomon's name means peace.
- Verse 8: Dominion and expansion of the kingdom
- Verses 9: Dominance over other tribes; "May his enemies lick the dust."
- Verse 10: Respected by other leaders and nations
- Verse 10: Tribute from other kings

Israel's Hope

- ¹ Endow the king with your justice, O God, the royal son with your righteousness.
- ² May he judge your people in righteousness, your afflicted ones with justice. (*Psalm 72:1-2*)
- 19 ...follow carefully all the words of this law and these decrees 20 and not consider himself better than his fellow Israelites and turn from the law to the right or to the left. (Deut 17: 19-20)

- ⁴ May he defend the afflicted among the people and save the children of the needy; may he crush the oppressor.
 - ¹² For he will deliver the needy who cry out, the afflicted who have no one to help.

- ¹⁴ He will rescue them from oppression and violence, for precious is their blood in his sight.

⁵² Praise be to the Lord forever! Amen and Amen.


(Doxology, Psalm 89:52, Closes Book III)


