

The Humble and Gentle King

Key idea:

Jesus came as the humble and gentle King, and He demonstrated these qualities, taught them and He gives His people the power to live them.

Key text:

Zechariah 9:9

Rejoice greatly, O Daughter of Zion! Shout, Daughter of Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and having salvation, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

Key points:

- 1. Israel expected Messiah to be a conquering king. Through humility and gentleness, Jesus came as a conquering King, Who conquered sin.
- 2. It was prophesied that Messiah would be gentle.
- 3. Jesus repeatedly demonstrated His humility and gentleness from His birth, through His death and beyond.
- 4. Jesus taught His followers to be humble and gentle.
- 5. Paul teaches that we are to be humble as Jesus is, and that the Holy Spirit gives us the power to be so.
- 6. Only those Who have received Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior have the help of the Holy Spirit to develop true humility and gentleness.

Questions for discussion/application:

- 1. What part of Sunday's teaching stood out most to you? Why?
- 2. Bobby said that "meekness (gentleness) is not weakness, rather it is great strength under control." Does this change your view of meekness? If so, how?

- 3. How are humility and gentleness similar? How are the different?
- 4. Can I identify areas in my life where I need to be more gentle/humble?
- 5. Can I identify relationships that challenge my ability to exercise gentleness/humility?
- 6. The Bible says, "Now is the day of salvation." Have I repented of my sin and truly received Jesus as my Savior? *
- 7. How does walking in humility/gentleness (or not walking in humility/gentleness) impact our testimony?
- 8. Who will I call or see to invite to gather with the church to rejoice and worship this week?
