


• Jesus forgives the sin of the paralytic (2:1-12)

- Jesus heals on the Sabbath (3:1-6)


A Series of Five Controversies





The Central Issue - Jesus' Identity & Authority • The Son of Man has authority to forgive sins (2:1-12)

- The Son of Man comes to call sinners (2:13-17)
- The Son of Man is the Bridegroom for the people of God and is the end of the ceremonial & sacrificial aspects of the law (2:18-22)
- The Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath (2:23-28)
- The Son of Man gives Sabbath healing & life (3:1-6)








Growing Disagreement & Antagonism They accuse Jesus of blasphemy in their hearts (2:1-12)

- They question Jesus' disciples (2:13-17)
- Others question Jesus about His disciples (2:18-22)
- They question Jesus about His disciples breaking of Sabbath traditions (2:23-28)
- They are looking to accuse Jesus, and plot to kill him (3:1-6)










Sabbath Rules for Healing they may not straighten a deformed body or set a




The Son of Man and the Sabbath



Jesus Brings the Man to the Front Jesus said to the man with the shriveled hand, "Stand up in front of everyone."



They Refuse To Answer






 Legalism blinds us to the grace of God at work around us

Legalism drains away joy


The Deadly Disease of Legalism
